## A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to establish a structure for visitor services on the Arlington Ridge tract, in the area of the U.S. Marine Corps War Memorial, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. DEFINITION.
- 4 In this Act, the term "Arlington Ridge tract" means
- 5 the parcel of Federal land located in Arlington County,
- 6 Virginia, known as the Nevius Tract and transferred to
- 7 the Department of the Interior in 1953, that is bounded
- 8 generally by—

1	(1) Arlington Boulevard (United States Route
2	50) to the north;
3	(2) Jefferson Davis Highway (Virginia Route
4	110) to the east;
5	(3) Marshall Drive to the south; and
6	(4) North Meade Street to the west.
