Info Source: Through March 2005, IMBA had extensive conversations with King Range Manager Gary Prichard-Peterson. Outdoor Recreation Planner Scott Adams for the King Range NCA, confirmed that the agency has not issued any administrative order closing trails in the King Range and has not posted trails as closed to bicycling. The King Range National Conservation Area Resource Management Plan and the BLM Wilderness Interim Management Policy details the management of recreation uses within the KRNCA and closes many of these trails to mountain bike access. The trails were open to mountain bike access prior to March 2005, but will be closed in accordance with the King Range Record of Decision (May 17, 2005). BLM is actively working to build new trails in the King Range area, in accordance with the RMP.
