

En Bloc Amendment to H.R. 4383
Offered by Mr. Lamborn

On page 2, line 5, strike “Notwithstanding section” and insert instead “Section”.

On page 4, beginning on line 12, strike “of the receipt of the description by the applicant” and insert instead “the applicant receives the description of the denial from the Secretary”.

On page 4, strike line 24 and insert instead “the final decision is made whether to”.

On page 4, line 25, insert “This fee shall not apply to any resubmitted application.” after “(A).”

On page 5, strike lines 15 through 18 and insert instead “retained by the Secretary of the Interior to be used, subject to appropriation, by the Bureau of Land Management to process permits, right-of-way applications, and other activities necessary for renewable development, and, at the discretion of the Secretary, by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service or other federal agencies involved in wind and solar permitting reviews to facilitate the processing of wind energy and solar energy permit applications on Bureau of Land Management lands.”.

On page 7, line 2, strike “Field” and insert “field”.

On page 7, line 23, insert “Bureau of Land Management” before “field”.

On page 8, strike lines 24 and 25 and insert instead: “the energy projects that arise under the authorities of the employee’s home agency; and”.

On page 9, line 6, insert “Bureau of Land Management” before “field”.

On page 9, strike line 8 and insert instead “fective approval and implementation of energy projects administered by the Bureau of Land Management”.

On page 10, after line 5, insert the following new section (and amend the table of contents accordingly):

“SEC. 303. POLICIES REGARDING BUYING, BUILDING, AND WORKING FOR AMERICA.

(a) CONGRESSIONAL INTENT.—It is the intent of Congress that—

(1) This Act will support a healthy and growing United States domestic energy sector that, in turn, helps to reinvigorate American manufacturing, transportation, and service sectors by employing the vast talents of United States workers to assist in the development of energy from domestic sources;

- (2) Congress will monitor the deployment of personnel and material onshore under this Act to encourage the development of American technology and manufacturing to enable United States workers to benefit from this Act through good jobs and careers, as well as the establishment of important industrial facilities to support expanded access to American energy resources.
- (b) **REQUIREMENT.**—The Secretary of the Interior shall, when possible and practicable, encourage the use of United States workers and equipment manufactured in the United States in all construction related to mineral resource development under this Act.”

In each place it appears, strike “appropriations” and insert “appropriation”.
