Throughout my career, I have been a champion of sportsmen's issues. During the Bush Administration, I served as a liaison to the sportsmen's community at DOI and USDA, focusing on facilitating relationships for

sportsmen with the BLM and USFS and integrating sportsmen's issues into agency decision making.

I initiated and organized the first-ever conference between DOI and AWCP to advance Wildlife for the 21st Century policy recommendations to the Administration. I conducted issue policy sessions with high-level Administration officials, the Interior Secretary, DOI Counsel and AWCP Executives, and created the charter for the Sporting Conservation Council (SCC), a federal advisory committee for the hunting community. I spearheaded BLM and USFS participation at the North American Wildlife and Natural Resources Conferences and the Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies oil and gas subcommittee; created energy liaison position for better communication with sportsmen's community; created an MOU with the Western Governors Association, DOI and USDA to create consistent mapping strategies for wildlife corridors. Additionally, I was a lead in the development of the White House Conference on North American Wildlife Policy which resulted in a ten year Recreational Hunting and Wildlife Conservation Plan. The ten year plan has been adopted by the Obama Administration in the charter for the current sportsmen's federal advisory committee, the Wildlife Hunting Heritage Conservation Council.

Safari Club has filed three lawsuits against the federal government in the last four years. They are listed below.

Safari Club International v. Salazar et al. No. 1:11-cv-01564- BAH (District Court for the District of Columbia), Safari Club International has sued the Secretary of the Interior, the Director of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service under the Endangered Species Act and Administrative Procedure Act, for illegally listing U.S. captive herds of scimitar-horned oryx, dama gazelle and addax as endangered species.

SCI, SCIF v. Salazar, Ashe, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, 08-881 (District Court for the District of Columbia), was filed in May 2008 challenging the Fish and Wildlife Service's denial of import permits for legally harvested polar bears. The lawsuit relied on the Endangered Species Act and the Marine Mammal Protection Act.

SCI, SCIF v. Salazar, Ashe, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, 08-1550 (District Court for the District of Columbia), filed Sept. 2008. In this case SCI challenged the Fish and Wildlife Service's decision to list the Polar Bear as threatened under the Endangered Species Act. The lawsuit relied on the Endangered Species Act.

BYLAWS OF SAFARI CLUB INTERNATIONAL

(As amended on May 10, 2008)

A non-profit corporation exempt from income tax as an organization described in Section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code of the United States of America.

ARTICLE I. NAME, SEAL, EMBLEMS, OFFICIAL JOURNAL, OFFICES AND STATE OF INCORPORATION

Section 1. Name and Acronym.

The name of this Corporation is "Safari Club International" and, when appropriate, may be designated by its own unique acronym, "SCI."

Section 2. Corporate Seal.

The official corporate seal of SCI, as authorized by the Board of Directors, bears the inscription "SAFARI CLUB INTERNATIONAL" and shows Arizona as the State of Incorporation and 1999 as the date of incorporation.

Section 3. Official Corporation and Chapter Emblems.

A. Official Corporation Emblem.

The official emblem consists of two world globes, one of North and South America on the left, and the other of Europe, Asia and Africa on the right, upon which is superimposed a Kenya Masai warrior shield, behind which are two long war/hunting spears, and on top of which is superimposed a black-maned lion. The words "Conservation of Wildlife" encircle the globe of the Americas and the words "Protection of the Hunter" encircle the globe of Europe, Asia, and Africa. On top of the emblem, the word "International" is centered above the shield and spears and, at the bottom, the word "Board" is centered below the shield and spears.

B. Official Chapter Emblem.

The official emblem to be used by the Chapters of SCI shall be the same black-maned lion, Masai warrior shield and long war/hunting spears, without the globes of the world on either side and without any wording.

C. Modification and Adoption of Other Emblems.

The official emblems of SCI and the Chapters may be modified or new emblems may be adopted by the Board of Directors. No Chapter shall use any emblem that has not been previously approved by SCI. A Chapter may seek approval of a proposed emblem by submitting a prototype of the emblem to the Executive Committee for consideration. At the first regularly scheduled meeting after receipt of such prototype, the Executive Committee shall determine whether or not the emblem embodies the spirit of the purposes of SCI. If so, the Executive Committee shall submit such emblem to the

Board of Directors for approval at its next regularly scheduled meeting. If not, the Executive Committee shall return the prototype to the Chapter with an explanation as to why such emblem was not approved. At the sole discretion of the Board of Directors, the Board of Directors may ratify the use of any emblem established by a Chapter prior to the adoption of this Section if such use was not previously approved by the Board of Directors.

D. Use of Emblems and other Intellectual Property.

(1) Authorization Required.

The corporate seal, emblem, name, logo, trademark, member lists, donor lists, mailing lists or other intellectual property to which SCI or the SCI Foundation has the rights (collectively, "Intellectual Property") may not be used by any person or entity unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Executive Committee or the Board of Directors. Except for use by Chapters, which is governed by Article XV, authority to authorize use of Intellectual Property shall be as follows:

(a) The Board of Directors or the Executive Committee may authorize any use.

(b) The Executive Director may authorize uses, which are not exclusive in nature. An exclusive use would be where a maker of certain goods was granted a right to use the Intellectual Property exclusive of all others who make similar or identical goods.

(2) Restrictions on Use.

Except for use by Chapters, which is governed by Article XV, the Intellectual Property shall not be used for marketing or other purposes having financial implications without the express written permission of SCI, which permission shall include terms and conditions of such use in the form of a legally-binding licensing agreement. SCI shall protect the use of Intellectual Property and, where appropriate, shall take actions reasonably necessary to restrict its use to authorized purposes only.

Section 4. Official Journal.

There shall be a special "OFFICIAL JOURNAL" section in one (1) or more periodicals that are published for the benefit of SCI members that shall provide the members with official notices and may inform the members of actions taken or to be taken by the Board of Directors or Executive Committee that require publication or that are to be considered by the members or provide such other information as may be deemed by the Board of Directors or Executive Committee to be important to the members. The Official Journal shall consist of one (1) or more pages that are distinguished from the other pages of the selected periodical.

Section 5. Offices.

The principal offices and place of business of SCI shall be located in Tucson, Arizona. The Corporation may also have offices at such other places, or may establish its principal office or offices at such other locations, as the Board of Directors may from time to time appoint or the purposes of the Corporation require.

Section 6. State of Incorporation.

Safari Club International is incorporated in the State of Arizona.

ARTICLE II. MISSION, PURPOSES AND OBJECTIVES

Section 1. Missions.

The mission of SCI is to protect the freedom to hunt and to promote wildlife conservation worldwide.

Section 2. Purpose and Objectives.

The purposes and objectives of Safari Club International are:

A. Protect Rights of Hunters.

To advocate, preserve and protect the rights of all hunters;

B. Promote Hunting.

To promote safe, legal and ethical hunting and related activities;

C. Engage in Advocacy.

Within the limits imposed by law and regulation, to monitor, support, educate or otherwise take positions on local, national and international legislative, executive, judicial or organizational endeavors that foster and support these purposes and objectives;

D. Educate Public Regarding Hunting.

To inform and educate the public concerning hunting and related activities;

E. Other Purposes.

To conduct those purposes set forth in SCI's Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE III. CHAIRMAN EMERITUS

The position of Chairman Emeritus was occupied for the duration of his life by CJ McElroy, the founder, first President and Chairman Emeritus of SCI. Upon his death, the position of Chairman Emeritus has been retired. There shall not be another Chairman Emeritus of SCI.

ARTICLE IV. MEMBERS

Section 1. Membership.

A. Membership Categories.

The Board of Directors shall determine the number and types of membership categories in the Corporation.

B. No Voting Members.

No member has the right to vote at any meetings.

C. Meetings of Members.

Unless otherwise determined by the Executive Committee or Board of Directors, there shall be no meetings of the members.

D. Membership Qualifications.

Any individual, family or business subscribing to the missions, objectives, purposes and policies of this Corporation, of good moral character, and demonstrating an active interest in both hunting and in wildlife conservation may be admitted to membership in the Corporation subject to the terms of these Bylaws.

E. Member in Good Standing.

A member in good standing is one who satisfies the membership qualifications, who exercises wildlife conservation principles, who is current in the payment of dues, fees and assessments to SCI and, if applicable, to one of its authorized Chapters, and who abides by the rules, regulations and qualifications of membership established by SCI or such Chapter.

F. Sportsmen's Code of Ethics.

(1) Establishment and Publication.

The Board of Directors has adopted a Sportsmen's Code of Ethics. Such Sportsman's Code of Ethics shall be made a part of these Bylaws, shall be published on the inside front or back cover of all official copies of these Bylaws and shall be published at least once each year in the Official Journal to remind members of their ethical responsibilities in the field.

(2) Members' Bound.

Every member of SCI shall be bound to adhere to the Sportsmen's Code of Ethics and shall be held accountable under disciplinary procedures authorized under these Bylaws for infractions to such Sportsmen's Code of Ethics.

Section 2. Admission of Members.

The Corporation shall accept applications for membership. Applications for membership may be reviewed and rejected by the Executive Committee of Safari Club International.

Section 3. Dues, Collection and Disbursement.

A. Fees and Dues.

The Board of Directors shall determine the initiation fees, membership dues and special assessments for all members.

B. SCI Centralized Billing System.

SCI shall, through a centralized computer billing system, invoice members on an annual

basis for annual member dues for National Members, International Members and all North American Chapter members. SCI shall collect and acknowledge receipt of such dues. SCI shall promptly remit to each North American Chapter such dues as have been collected for the Chapter. Chapters located outside North America shall invoice members for and collect Chapter dues pursuant to their rules and shall transmit the funds required under the Bylaws to SCI in accordance with the laws of each respective nation.

C. Delinquency.

Annual member dues become delinquent when unpaid for sixty (60) days following the date of invoice.

Section 4. Certificates of Membership.

At the option of the Executive Committee, a certificate of membership may be issued to each new member in such form as the Executive Committee may prescribe, which shall be signed by both the President and the Secretary.

Section 5. Voluntary Termination of Membership.

Any member may resign by filing with the Secretary of SCI a written resignation. Dues paid in advance shall not be refunded nor prorated. Such resignation shall not relieve such resigning member from the obligation to pay dues, fees or special assessments that have accrued to the date of such resignation and remain unpaid.

Section 6. Involuntary Termination of Membership.

A. Default in Payment of Dues.

Any member in default in payment of fees, dues or assessments shall be automatically terminated from membership.

B. Suspension, Expulsion or other Action.

(1) Reasons for Suspension or Expulsion – Ethics Committee.

Any individual, organization, company or other legal person that is a member of SCI may have any or all of its membership privileges suspended for a period of time, or may be expelled with loss of all membership privileges, or any other disciplinary action, under the procedures set forth in Subsection B(3) and Subsection C below, for the following reasons:

(a) A violation of the Sportsmen's Code of Ethics; a matter which has been adjudicated by a competent body to be a violation of law or regulation regarding hunting shall be considered on its face to qualify as a possible violation of the Sportsmen's Code of Ethics;

(b) Conduct towards an SCI member in connection with or in relationship to a hunt or a contract or agreement for a hunt that involves substantial elements of one (1) or more of the following:

(i) deceit;

(ii) willful ignorance or recklessness;

(iii) intentional misstatement or misrepresentation;

(iv) civil or criminal fraud; or

- (v) in connection with a hunt, negligent or reckless exposure to physical danger beyond that ordinarily considered a part of that hunt;
- (c) Refusing, after written demand has been made, to honor a financial obligation to SCI or the SCI Foundation for the purchase of an item for which the person or entity became obligated during the SCI Annual Convention or other SCI function or activity;
- (d) Obtaining membership in SCI by a material false or misleading statement; or
- (e) Abuse of the ethics provisions of these Bylaws, including, without limitation:
 - (i) making false statements to the Ethics Committee during the investigation of an ethics complaint or during testimony to the Committee, with knowledge that the statements were false or with obvious lack of concern for the truthfulness of the statements; or
 - (ii) filing an ethics complaint that is determined to be materially and recklessly false in substantially all of its allegations, groundless, frivolous or appears to have been intended primarily to affect the election of officers or Board members of SCI, to affect the normal decision-making process of SCI or the SCI Foundation, or to be disruptive of an already-pending ethics proceeding or of other business of SCI or the SCI Foundation.

(2) Other Reasons for Suspension or Expulsion – Board of Inquiry.

Any individual, organization, company or other legal person that is a member of SCI may have any or all of its membership privileges suspended for a period of time, or may be expelled with loss of all membership privileges, or any other disciplinary action, under the procedures set forth in Subsection B(3) below and Article VIII, Section 8, for the following reasons:

- (a) publication of any defamatory written or oral communication, either anonymously or signed, in regard to a member of SCI or staff of SCI or the SCI Foundation and which is not true or otherwise defensible under the law of defamation in the State of Arizona;
- (b) failure to keep a confidence as required by these Bylaws;
- (c) financial dishonesty (including, without limitation, misappropriation of SCI's or the SCI Foundation's funds or property) with respect to dealings with SCI or the SCI Foundation;
- (d) misconduct that has a materially adverse effect upon the purposes or reputation of SCI or the SCI Foundation; or
- (e) the conviction of, or plea of guilty or nolo contendere to, any felony or a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude or fraud.

The foregoing provisions of this Subsection B(2) apply only to misconduct in relation to SCI and to the SCI Foundation, and not to misconduct in relation to a chapter of SCI or a chapter of the SCI Foundation. Any misconduct related to a chapter of SCI or the SCI Foundation is governed by the bylaws of that chapter.

(3) Emergency Suspension.

(a) A member may have any or all membership privileges suspended by the Executive Committee upon the recommendation of the Ethics Committee or the Board of Inquiry, as applicable, without any hearing or other procedure prescribed by these Bylaws, provided that there is reasonable information available to the Ethics Committee or the Board of Inquiry, as applicable, that an emergency situation exists in connection with the "Reasons for Suspension or Expulsion" described in Subsections B(1) and B(2) above, and that failure to take immediate action may be reasonably expected to result in harm to SCI or its members.

(b) No such suspension may last for more than ninety (90) days unless reconsidered and reaffirmed by the Ethics Committee or the Board of Inquiry, as applicable, and the Executive Committee.

(c) The member subject to an emergency suspension shall be immediately notified in writing of the reasons for the suspension, and shall be given an opportunity to be heard at the first reasonable time available.

(d) At the option of the Executive Committee, notice may be published in the Official Journal setting forth the emergency suspension and describing the nature of the matter.

C. Procedure of the Ethics Committee for Suspension, Expulsion or Other Action.

(1) Initiation of Action.

(a) Any member of SCI in good standing may file a complaint with the Ethics Committee against any individual, organization, business or other legal entity that is also a member of SCI, and in the event of a withdrawal of a complaint by the complainant, the Committee may, at its discretion, retain jurisdiction in the case. The complaint must be in writing, signed and sworn to before a notary public or other person authorized to administer oaths. The complaint shall distinctly describe any act that the complainant contends is contrary to or in violation of subsection 6(B)(1) of this Article or the Sportsmen's Code of Ethics.

(b) A complaint may also be originated by the Ethics Committee, based on information that has come before the Committee.

(c) Once a complaint has been properly filed, the Ethics Committee retains jurisdiction in the case even if the membership of a party to the case expires or the member resigns. In the case of sanctions agreed to by the Board of Directors against a member whose membership has expired or who has resigned membership prior to the Board's final action on sanctions, notice of SCI's final action on sanctions may be published in the Official Journal and the sanctions shall apply from the time that member reapplies for membership.

(d) No case shall be initiated if more than five (5) years has passed from the time of the alleged violation to the time of the filing of the complaint. The running of the five (5) year period, however, does not begin until the Committee or the complainant knew or should have known of the

existence of the occurrence of the event that is the basis of the complaint, provided that in no event shall the period exceed seven (7) years from the time of the occurrence of the event that is the basis of the complaint.

(e) Solely for the purposes of jurisdiction of the Ethics Committee in considering the suspension, expulsion or other action against a member, any person who is an officer, director or a principal in a company that holds a membership in SCI shall be considered a member of SCI, any company that has an officer, director or principal who is a member shall be considered a member of SCI, and any person who is employed, whether permanently or temporarily, by a person or a company that is an exhibitor at SCI's Annual Convention, and is present at that Convention, shall be considered a member of SCI. The fact that the specific name of such a person or company described in the preceding sentence is not listed in the official membership roster or database of SCI shall not be a bar to the filing of a complaint before the Ethics Committee. If a sanction is prescribed against such a person or company pursuant to all of the procedures set forth herein, the sanction shall operate to prevent that person and the company with which he is affiliated, as set forth above, from having any contacts or dealings with SCI, its Chapters or the SCI Foundation for the period of time specified in the sanction.

(2) Consideration of the Complaint by the Ethics Committee.

(a) The complaint shall be considered by the Ethics Committee pursuant to the published procedures of that Committee. These procedures shall include the provision of a copy of the complaint to the respondent, the right of the respondent to be heard and the right of the respondent to be represented by counsel or by any other person.

(b) The Ethics Committee may develop further information on the matters presented in the complaint through any means available to it, including the holding of informational hearings. The participation of any party in proceedings before the Ethics Committee is subject to limitation by its chairman in order to assure relevancy, materiality and proper conduct.

(c) Any complaint deemed to be without merit or that fails to involve a violation of the Bylaws or the Sportsmen's Code of Ethics shall be dismissed by the Ethics Committee.

(d) With the exception of complaints filed by the Ethics Committee, any complaint that is not filed by an individual who is a current member of SCI against an individual, company or other legal entity that is a current member of SCI (as "member" is described in Subsection C(1)(e) above) shall not be considered a valid complaint and the Ethics Committee shall have no jurisdiction over the matter. In like manner, no complaint shall stand if filed in regard to an action taken by a body of SCI or SCI Foundation or a member of SCI in his official capacity acting for a body of SCI or SCI Foundation. The term "body" in the preceding sentence shall mean the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee or any duly

appointed Committee. The Ethics Committee shall have no jurisdiction over such a complaint.

(3) Recommendation by the Ethics Committee; Proposed Action by the Executive Committee.

(a) After consideration of the complaint, and the complaint is not dismissed, the Ethics Committee shall make a recommendation to the Executive Committee. Such recommendation may be for expulsion, for suspension of membership privileges for a period of time or for any appropriate lesser action.

(b) The Executive Committee may agree, disagree or decide to propose action different from that recommended by the Ethics Committee. The decision shall be taken by majority vote of the Executive Committee.

(c) If the matter is dismissed by the Executive Committee, the respondent shall be so notified in writing.

(d) If the Executive Committee proposes to suspend or expel the respondent, or to impose some lesser sanction, the respondent shall be notified in writing by the Secretary of SCI and shall be given the opportunity for a hearing before the Ethics Committee. A letter of reprimand shall not be considered a sanction. Such notification may be sent by telefax, electronic mail or other electronic means, followed by a confirming copy by regular mail to the address of record of the member. Such notification shall include a copy of these procedures and shall inform the respondent of the proposed action, his right to a hearing before the Ethics Committee and that, unless he requests a hearing in writing within thirty (30) days of the first receipt of the notification (whether by regular mail or electronically), the proposed action shall become final. Notification shall be deemed to have been received within five (5) days after mailing or, in the case of addresses outside the United States, within ten (10) days.

(4) Suspension or Expulsion Hearing by the Ethics Committee.

(a) When a respondent has timely requested a hearing on the proposed action of the Executive Committee, such hearing shall be conducted by the Ethics Committee at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting following the notification to the respondent. If the timing of the scheduled hearing would work a hardship on the respondent, the chairman of the Ethics Committee may arrange to hear the matter at another time. At his sole discretion, the chairman of the Ethics Committee may allow the respondent to participate in the hearing telephonically if he cannot appear in person.

(b) At the hearing, the respondent may offer statements, testimony of others or exhibits on his own behalf. The complainant may also be invited to be present at the hearing, but such presence is not required. A summary record of the hearing shall be made.

(c) The participation of any party in proceedings before the Ethics Committee, or by or with his attorney or other representative, is subject to limitation by the chairman of the Ethics Committee in order to assure relevancy, materiality and proper conduct.

(5) Refusal to Appear or to Answer Questions.

If a party is requested to appear at a hearing and refuses to do so, the Ethics Committee may draw an adverse inference from such refusal to appear. If a party is requested to answer questions during a hearing and refuses to do so on the grounds that the testimony may be self-incriminating, the Ethics Committee may draw an adverse inference from such refusal to answer questions.

(6) Final Action Following a Hearing for Suspension or Expulsion.

(a) At its earliest possible convenience, the Ethics Committee shall make either a decision to dismiss the matter or a recommendation for final action in the nature of a sanction to the Executive Committee. A recommended sanction may be for expulsion or suspension for a period of time, or for any appropriate lesser action. The Ethics Committee's recommended sanction may differ from its earlier recommendation or from the sanction proposed by the Executive Committee.

(b) The Executive Committee shall consider the recommendation of the Ethics Committee and shall, by majority vote, determine its final action. If the final action is to impose a sanction of expulsion, suspension, or some lesser action, the matter shall be presented to the Board for ratification, in executive session, at its next regularly scheduled meeting. The chairman of the Ethics Committee shall provide the Board with an oral and/or written summary of the matter, the action decided by the Executive Committee and the reasons therefor. The Board may dismiss the matter, may agree with and ratify the action or may modify the action as follows:

(i) By a majority vote, the Board may decide to accept and ratify the final sanctions determined by the Executive Committee.

(ii) By a two-thirds (2/3) vote, the Board may decide to reject or amend the final sanctions determined by the Executive Committee.

(iii) Failure to obtain a two-thirds (2/3) vote in amending the final sanctions determined by the Executive Committee shall result in a dismissal of the complaint.

(c) The respondent and complainant shall be notified in writing of the Board's decision.

(d) Any sanction adopted as provided herein also applies to any business entity controlled directly or indirectly by the sanctioned member, his or her spouse, or other closely related family member, prior to or during the period of the sanction, provided that the sanction shall not apply if, on the basis of information provided to it, the Ethics Committee recommends and the Executive Committee agrees that the business entity controlled by the

spouse or other closely related family member is not sufficiently related to the sanctioned member to merit the application of the sanction.

(7) Reconsideration.

(a) After an action has become final under these provisions, the respondent may request that the Executive Committee reconsider the final decision that an ethical violation has occurred or the final decision regarding any sanction. The Board of Directors, on its own motion, may also require a reconsideration of the final decision that an ethical violation has occurred or a reconsideration of the final decision regarding the sanction. Any such action by the Executive Committee or the Board shall require (i) prior consultation with the chairman of the Ethics Committee or his designee and (ii) a two-thirds (2/3) vote for passage, and thereafter shall be referred to the Ethics Committee.

(b) The Ethics Committee shall review the entire case and shall decide whether the matter should be reopened for further proceedings.

(c) In the case of a reconsideration requested by the respondent, if the Committee's proceedings result in a recommendation that is different from that in the original case, then the matter shall be treated as a new case and shall follow all the procedures required hereunder.

(d) In the case of a reconsideration requested by the Board, the results of the Ethics Committee's proceedings shall be reported to the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall, in turn, report their findings to the Board. The Board shall then take final action as set forth herein.

D. Procedure of the Board of Inquiry for Suspension, Expulsion or Other Action.

The procedure for a member's suspension or expulsion or other action against a member by the Board of Inquiry is set forth in Article VIII, Section 8.

E. Effect of Suspension, Expulsion or other Action.

(1) No Obligation of Repayment.

No member suspended or expelled will be entitled to any refund of dues or contributions already paid; however, a member suspended on any emergency basis may be entitled to receive a pro-rata refund of payments made to SCI for participation in SCI's Convention or for advertisements in SCI's publications.

(2) Eligibility for Officer, Director or Committee Member.

If a person is subject to a sanction, including probation, such person may not hold office, be a Director or serve on a Committee in SCI or in any Chapter of SCI during the period of probation. If the person is already an Officer or Director or serves on a Committee of SCI or a Chapter of SCI, that position shall be considered vacated and SCI or the Chapter, as applicable, shall take steps to fill the position, either temporarily for the period of the probation or permanently.

Section 7. Eligibility for Awards.

A member who has been (a) sanctioned for a violation of any of the reasons set forth in

Sections 6B(1), B(2) or B(3) above, or (b) found in violation (by a finding of guilt or responsibility) to any governmental law or regulation concerning hunting in any jurisdiction that is punishable by a sentence of jail or imprisonment and/or a fine of \$10,000 or more shall thereafter be ineligible for, and may not be given, any award authorized by SCI which is selected and granted by an award committee or subcommittee of SCI. The ineligibility for awards set forth in this Section 7 shall not apply to SCI Trophy Awards and World Hunting Awards programs.

Section 8. Reinstatement of a Former Member.

Reinstatement of a former member shall be made in the same manner as for an applicant for new membership. As a condition precedent to such reinstatement, the applicant shall be required to pay all dues, fees and special assessments that were previously due and unpaid at the time of the termination of membership.

ARTICLE V. NOMINATING PROCEDURES

Section 1. Nominating Committee Report.

The Nominating Committee shall nominate not more than two (2) nominees for the each of the following offices: for the office of President-Elect, for the three (3) of each of the six (6) Vice President positions whose two (2) year terms will be completed at the end of the current fiscal year, for any Vice President position that has become open because such Vice President has chosen to become a candidate for another office at the end of his first year, for the offices of the Secretary and Treasurer, for each open Regional Representative, Director-at-Large, International Director and SCI Foundation Director-at-Large, and for not more than ten (10) Honorary International Directors. The annual report of the Nominating Committee shall be provided to all members of the Board of Directors not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of the scheduled elections conducted by the Board. Every nominated candidate shall have the opportunity to have a brief biography and photograph published in the Official Journal as part of this report. If the report is mailed, the date of the postmark shall establish the time of publishing the report.

Section 2. Nominations by Petition.

Anyone desiring to be nominated to any of the offices listed in Section 1 above, or who desires to nominate another person for any one of such offices, may do so by a petition in writing signed by not less than twenty (20) members of the Board of Directors and filed with the Secretary not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of elections by the Board of Directors. If such petition is mailed, the date of the postmark shall establish the time of filing the Petition.

Section 3. Nominations from the Floor.

A. Authority.

The chair of the Board shall open the floor for nominations for Regional Representatives, Directors-at-Large, and International Directors. The chair of the Board

shall not open the floor for nominations for any Officer position unless a nominee has not been elected to a higher position sought as an Officer, in which case, such nominee may be nominated from the floor for any other available office or Director position.

B. Recognition of Nominations.

If the chair of the Board opens the floor for nominations, a member need not be recognized by the chair in order to make a nomination and no second is required for a nomination [but sometimes one or more members may wish to second a nomination to indicate endorsement].

C. Motion to Close Nominations.

A motion to close nominations is out of order if any member is seeking the floor to make a nomination. When there is no further response to an inquiry from the chair of the Board for nominations, the chair will declare the nominations closed, or the chair may entertain such a motion from the floor [that would then require a two-thirds (2/3) vote for adoption]; however, nominations may always be reopened by majority vote.

Section 4. Introduction of Nominees.

Prior to the commencement of balloting for any office or Director position, each nominee shall be individually introduced and shall be given the privilege of the floor for two (2) minutes for the purpose of an introductory statement and may be requested to answer questions from the members present [which time shall not be charged against the nominee's time]. Such time for statements of nominees may be given to or divided with another member for the purpose of support or recommendation of the nominee.

Section 5. Candidates Forum.

Prior to the election of members of the Officers, a Candidates Forum will be scheduled for the purpose of providing all nominees for Officer positions an opportunity to state their qualifications and answer questions from a moderator appointed by the Nominating Committee.

Section 6. SCI President Seeking a Second Term.

In the event the SCI President decides to seek a second one (1) year term, he or she shall so notify the Nominating Committee in writing prior to the date that the Nominating Committee convenes to deliberate the proposed nominees. The Nominating Committee, at its discretion, may nominate or refuse to nominate the SCI President for a second one (1) year term. If the Nominating Committee nominates the SCI President for a second one (1) year term, then on the date of the scheduled elections conducted by the Board, the Board shall determine by majority vote if the SCI President shall serve a second term. If, and only if, the SCI President is not nominated by the Nominating Committee, the SCI President may seek a second one (1) year term by petition in writing signed by not less than twenty (20) members of the Board of Directors, and filed with the Secretary not less than sixty (60) days prior to the date of the election conducted by the Board. If such petition is mailed, the date of the postmark shall establish the time of filing the petition. The SCI President shall not be nominated from the floor for a second one (1) year term.

ARTICLE VI. OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers.

The Officers of SCI shall consist of the President, the President-Elect, Deputy President-Elect (if any), six (6) Vice-Presidents, the President of the Sables, the Secretary and the Treasurer. In addition, the Board may elect such other Officers or Assistant Officers as it may determine to be necessary.

Section 2. Qualifications.

A. Member in Good Standing.

To be eligible to hold office, an Officer must be a life, full chapter, or full member in good standing of SCI and must be a member of the Board of Directors.

B. Questionnaire.

All candidates for election as Officers of SCI are required to complete questionnaires indicating that they do not have any employment conflicts nor conflicts of interest concerning SCI or the SCI Foundation and indicating whether or not they have been convicted of any wildlife offense or of any felony.

Section 3. Nominations, Election, Terms of Office, Limitations and Vacancies.

A. Nomination of Officers.

Nominations for persons for election to the offices of President-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer and Vice President shall be made, and notice of nominees shall be given, pursuant to Article V.

B. Election of Officers.

(1) Upon Expiration of Terms.

As the offices of President-Elect, Secretary, Treasurer and Vice President become vacant due to the expiration of the Officer's term, the Officers to fill such offices shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors, and shall serve until their successors assume office. Elections shall occur at the first regular meeting of the Board immediately following the Annual Convention. Vacancies occurring in an office prior to the expiration of the term of such office shall be filled in accordance with Subsection E below.

(2) Ballots.

First, the President-Elect, Secretary and Treasurer shall be voted on in that order, with the election of each Officer to take place on a separate ballot. Then, all Vice President positions shall be voted on simultaneously on a single ballot. Ballots for officers shall allow for a "yes" or "no" vote for each candidate running unopposed.

(3) Elections.

(a) In the election of officers, if a nominee is running unopposed the votes will be "yes" or "no," and if the nominee fails to get a majority of the "yes" and "no" votes cast, then the position shall be considered vacant and may be filled according to the appropriate provisions of these Bylaws.

(b) Regarding an election for an officer position for which there are three or more nominees, if no nominee gets a majority of the votes cast in the first round of voting, the two nominees getting the greatest number of votes will remain on the ballot and a second round of voting will occur.

(c) The election of the at-large position on the Board of the Safari Club International Foundation, provided for in Article IV(3)(A) of the SCIF Bylaws and elected by the Board of Directors of SCI, shall be elected in the same manner as in (a) and (b) above.

(d) In the election of all other positions on the Board, the nominees getting the highest number of votes shall fill the available positions.

C. Terms of Officers.

(1) Generally.

Each elected Officer shall take office on July 1 following his election and shall hold office for a period of one (1) year, except as provided herein.

(2) Office of President-Elect.

The President-Elect is elected President in advance, to serve under and work with the President. The President-Elect assumes office when a vacancy occurs in the office of President, either due to the inability or refusal of the President to complete his term of office or due to the end of the term of the President, whichever occurs first. The end of the term of the President-Elect may be in one (1) or two (2) years, depending upon whether or not the current President is elected to a second term.

(3) Office of Deputy President-Elect.

In the event the SCI President is elected to a second one (1) year term, the President-Elect shall continue to serve in the office of President-Elect until the end of the President's second one (1) year term. In such an event, an office of Deputy President-Elect shall be created, and shall be filled for a one (1) year term by the person elected President-Elect from among those who had been nominated, either by the Nominating Committee or by petition, for the position. The Deputy President-Elect shall be an Officer and shall have a voting seat on the Executive Committee. In the event that there shall be a Deputy President-Elect, the Nominating Committee shall not select a President-Elect candidate for the subsequent annual election, but the Deputy President-Elect shall become the President-Elect.

(4) Offices of Vice Presidents.

The six (6) Vice Presidents shall be elected for two (2) year staggered terms, three (3) such Vice Presidents being elected each year; provided, however, that should an elected Vice President choose to become a candidate for any other office on

the Executive Committee at the end of his first year of a two (2) year term of office, he shall, at the end of the first year of the term, forfeit the balance of remainder of such term as Vice President, whether or not he is elected to the other office.

D. Limitations.

(1) Limitations on Terms.

The President shall be limited to two (2) successive one (1) year terms. There are no limits to the number of terms to which the other Officers may be elected.

(2) Disqualification of Immediate Past President.

An immediate Past President of Safari Club International shall not be entitled to hold any elected position within SCI for a period of one (1) year following expiration of his term or terms as President.

(3) Prohibition Against Holding National Office in Other Organizations.

No Officer of SCI may concurrently hold any similar national office with any other hunting/conservation organization or corporation with similar purposes and objectives, except upon approval of the Board of Directors.

E. Vacancies.

(1) Inability of President and President-Elect to Serve.

In case of an inability or refusal of the President and President-Elect to serve, the Deputy President-Elect (if any) or one (1) of the Vice Presidents may be elected by the Executive Committee [subject to confirmation by the Board of Directors] to perform the duties of the President on an interim basis, under such terms and conditions as the Executive Committee and Board may prescribe. If the Deputy President-Elect (if any) and all six (6) Vice Presidents shall be unwilling or unable to serve, the Secretary shall temporarily perform the duties as President, under such terms and conditions as the Executive Committee may prescribe.

(2) Vacancy in the Office of President-Elect.

In the event a vacancy occurs in the office of President-Elect, such vacancy shall be filled by the Deputy President-Elect (if any) or one (1) of the Vice Presidents on an interim appointment made by the Executive Committee, subject to confirmation or election of a President-Elect by the Board of Directors.

(3) Vacancy in the Office of a Vice President.

In the event a vacancy occurs in the office of a Vice President, such office shall be filled by the Alternate to the Executive Committee as described in Article IX; thereafter, the office of the Alternate need not be filled unless the Executive Committee determines otherwise, in which event, an election to fill the office of the Alternate shall be conducted at the next meeting of the Board of Directors following the occurrence of the vacancy.

(4) Vacancy in the Office of Secretary or Treasurer.

In the event a vacancy occurs in the office of Secretary or Treasurer, the vacancy may be filled by one (1) of the Vice Presidents on an interim appointment by the Executive Committee, subject to confirmation or election of a Secretary or a Treasurer by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. Duties and Powers of Officers.

A. The President.

The President shall provide leadership and policy guidance and management direction to SCI and its members, performing all duties usually incident to the office of President, and shall perform such other duties as may properly be assigned to him by the Board of Directors or the Executive Committee. The President shall be subject to the authority of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee. More specifically, he shall:

(1) Preside as the chair at all meetings of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee;

(2) Prepare agendas for all meetings of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors of the SCI Foundation;

(3) Sign official correspondence of SCI and, unless prohibited or limited by these Bylaws (with respect to any person or Committee) or by the Board of Directors, sign agreements and other documents that legally bind the Corporation, provided that the authority to sign any document hereunder may be delegated by the President or by the Executive Committee in writing to any other officer of the Corporation or to the Executive Director;

(4) Officially represent SCI and speak on its behalf in the public sector;

(5) After conferring with the Executive Committee, create new Standing or Special Committees and appoint chairmen of all Committees, except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws; and

(6) Be an ex-officio member of all Committees, with vote, except for the Nominating Committee, Audit Committee and the Sables. The President shall be prohibited from involvement in the deliberations or decisions of the Nominating Committee with respect to selection or rejection of any prospective candidates for any office that is under the jurisdiction of the Nominating Committee.

(7) Along with the Executive Committee, authorize the use of outside and in-house legal counsel by the Corporation, Directors, Officers and members.

B. The President-Elect; Deputy President-Elect.

(1) The President-Elect shall assist the President as requested in the performance of the President's duties; shall assist the President and other relevant officials in formulating the SCI budget for the following year or years; shall assist the President in the formulation of long-term planning; shall assume the duties of the President in his absence or inability or refusal to act; and shall perform such other

duties as the President, the Executive Committee or the Board of Directors may assign.

(2) The Deputy President-Elect (if any) shall assist the President and the President-Elect as requested in the performance of the President's duties and shall have such other duties as the President, the President-Elect, the Executive Committee or the Board of Directors may assign.

C. The Vice Presidents.

Each of the six (6) Vice Presidents shall perform such duties as the President, the Executive Committee or the Board of Directors may assign.

D. The President of the Sables.

The President of the Sables shall serve as an additional or seventh Vice President of SCI and shall perform such duties as the President, the Executive Committee or the Board of Directors may assign.

E. The Secretary.

The Secretary shall:

- (1) Ensure that notices of any meetings of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors of the SCI Foundation, are distributed in accordance with these Bylaws, as may be directed by the Board of Directors or Executive Committee or as required by law;
- (2) Keep a permanent record of the minutes of meetings of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors of the SCI Foundation;
- (3) Keep a permanent record of the actions of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors of the SCI Foundation that are taken without a meeting;
- (4) To the extent possible, ensure that a register of the mail addresses, electronic mail addresses, telephone and telefax or other electronic numbers of each Officer, Director and member of SCI is maintained on a current basis;
- (5) Conduct correspondence of SCI with its members and with others, maintaining records of such correspondence; and
- (6) Perform such other duties as the President, the Executive Committee or the Board of Directors may assign.

F. The Treasurer.

The Treasurer shall:

- (1) In consultation with the Director of Finance and the Audit Committee, have charge of the books of account of the Corporation and assist the firm of Certified Public Accountants selected by the Executive Committee to make an annual audit

of the books of account of the Corporation; prepare a statement of financial condition as of the close of each fiscal year established by the Board of Directors; and furnish a copy of such statement, together with a certificate of audit, to each member of the Board of Directors;

(2) Coordinate with appropriate officials in the placement of funds of the Corporation in such banks as may be designated by the Finance/Investment Committee and as may be ratified by the Executive Committee; and

(3) Have such other duties as the President, the Executive Committee or the Board of Directors may assign.

Section 5. Bonding of Treasurer and Director of Finance.

With due regard to the duties and responsibilities of both the SCI Treasurer and the Director of Finance regarding the financial and investment requirements outlined in these Bylaws, and with further regard to their other responsibilities and assigned duties in and for the Corporation, both the Treasurer and Director of Finance shall be adequately bonded for the faithful performance of their fiduciary obligations in an amount sufficient to fully protect both SCI and its members. It shall be a particular duty and responsibility of both the Treasurer and the Director of Finance to ensure that operational procedures of the Corporation are adequate and sufficient to maintain the existing tax-exempt status of SCI as described in these Bylaws.

ARTICLE VII. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Board of Directors.

The property, affairs, business, and policies of Safari Club International are managed by the Board of Directors, which consists of the following members:

A. The Executive Committee.

All members of the Executive Committee as identified in Article VIII.

B. Past Presidents.

Past Presidents of SCI and of the SCI Conservation Fund.

C. Regional Representatives.

Regional Representatives elected to represent designated geographical regions, each region having a region number. In order to qualify as a Regional Representative, a person must be a current Chapter president or must have at some time been a Chapter president. With the blanket exception of the entire Asia Region, every Regional Representative shall be a resident of a nation in the Region he represents, and also shall be a member of a Chapter in such Region. The Regional Representative shall be the principal liaison between SCI, the SCI Foundation, and Chapters in their regions, who also shall have additional responsibility for organizing new Chapters in their regions, and who shall assist the President in the performance of his duties with respect

to those designated regions. The number of Regional Representatives may be increased or decreased as necessary pursuant to relevant decisions adopted by the Board of Directors.

D. Chapter Presidents.

The President of each Chapter of Safari Club International, subject to Article XV of these Bylaws and Article XVI of the Safari Club International Foundation Bylaws.

E. Directors-at-Large, International Directors, Honorary International Directors.

(1) Not more than twenty (20) Directors-at-Large from the membership elected annually to the Board of Directors.

(2) Not more than eight (8) International Directors elected annually to the Board of Directors.

(a) To be eligible to serve as an International Director, a person must have:
(i) been a member of SCI in good standing for a minimum of five (5) years; and

(ii) served in at least one (1) of the following positions: (A) Chapter president, (B) a member of a Chapter's board for two (2) years, or (C) a Regional Representative for at least one (1) year.

(b) Notwithstanding Subsection E(2)(a) above a person is eligible to serve as an International Director if he has been nominated by the SCI Nominating Committee for that position after having satisfied the Nominating Committee that he possesses experience in government, business, public office, or not-for-profit conservation activities that is comparable to the experience that of a person qualified under Subsection (e)(2)(A) above.

(c) Prior to taking office, an International Director shall sign an affidavit attesting that he has not been convicted of any criminal violation for which a person may be sentenced to a jail term of one (1) year or more or any local, state, national or international wildlife law violations.

(d) The function of an International Director is to work in his particular geographic area of residence by:

(i) helping to start new chapters;

(ii) visiting and guiding existing chapters, specifically in regard to compliance with the SCI Bylaws and policies that govern chapters; and

(iii) representing SCI at meetings of national or international hunting and/or conservation organizations when asked to do so by the appropriate Regional Representative or by the President of SCI.

(e) An International Director must coordinate his goals and work with the Regional Representative responsible for the geographical area in which the International Director is operating.

(f) An International Director shall be required to attend a minimum of one (1) SCI Board meetings annually.

(g) An International Director may serve as a member of any Standing or Special Committee of SCI, and may serve as the chair or vice-chair of such Committee.

(h) International Directors in office at the time of adoption of this Bylaw shall retain their positions until the end of their term, even if they do not comply with the requirements of this Subsection (e)(2).

(3) Honorary International Directors (not more than ten (10) of whom are nominated by the Nominating Committee annually) who are neither United States citizens nor United States residents.

(a) An Honorary International Director shall serve as a representative to the public at large for SCI's interests in the international area;

(b) An Honorary International Director is an ex officio member of the SCI Board of Directors without vote and is not counted in the establishment of a quorum; and

(c) An Honorary International Director shall serve until the end of term to which he was elected.

Section 2. Qualifications of Directors.

Subject to the qualifications set forth in Section 1 above, a member shall be eligible for election to the position of Director if he shall have attained the age of twenty-five (25) years and shall be a member in good standing.

Section 3. Election and Terms of Certain Directors.

A. Nominations.

Nominations of persons for election to each open position of Regional Representative and for all positions of Director-at-Large, International Director and Honorary International Director shall be made, and notice of nominees shall be given, pursuant to Article V.

B. Elections.

At the first regular meeting of the Board of Directors immediately following the Annual Convention, the Regional Representatives, Directors-at-Large, International Directors and Honorary International Directors shall be elected by the then current members of the Board of Directors.

C. Term.

(1) The Regional Representatives, Directors-at-Large, International Directors and Honorary International Directors shall take office as members of SCI Board of Directors on July 1 following the meeting at which they were elected.

(2) The Directors-at-Large and International Directors shall hold office for a period of one (1) year or until their successors have been elected and assume the duties of office.

(3) The Regional Representatives shall be elected for two (2) year terms, with one-half (1/2) of the Regional Representatives being elected each year, and shall hold office until their successors have been elected and assume the duties of office. In the first year in which this provision takes effect [Editor's Note: the elections of May, 2004], the Regional Representatives for even-numbered regions and combined regions shall be elected for one (1) year and the Regional Representatives for odd-numbered regions shall be elected for two (2) years.

(4) The Honorary International Directors shall hold office for a period of one (1) year.

D. SCI Foundation Director-at-Large.

The SCI Foundation Director-at-Large shall be nominated pursuant to Article V and the Board of Directors shall elect the SCI Foundation Director-at-Large at the first regular meeting of the Board of Directors immediately following the Annual Convention.

Section 4. Suspension of Right to Serve on the Board of Directors.

Any person, other than a Past President, who serves on the Board of Directors in any capacity but fails to personally attend at least one (1) meeting of the Board of Directors in any calendar year shall be automatically suspended from membership and service on the Board for a period of one (1) year. However, for good cause shown, this provision may be waived by a majority vote of the Board.

Section 5. Vacancies.

Subsequent vacancies occurring on the Board of Directors for positions of Regional Representative, International Director or Director-at-Large shall be filled by the Board of Directors. A vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors for an individual who sits on the Board as a Chapter president will be filled by the Chapter. A vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors for an individual who sits on the Board as the President of the Sables will be filled by the Sables. A Director so elected in any of these categories shall hold office for the unexpired term of his predecessor.

Section 6. Meetings of the Board.

A. Regular Meetings.

Regular meetings of the Board of Directors may be scheduled at any time and place fixed by the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee or the President.

B. Special Meetings.

Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be scheduled upon the call of the President or the Executive Committee, or upon the request of at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the Board of Directors.

C. Executive Session.

Any meeting of the Board of Directors may be held in executive session as set forth in Article XIV.

D. Records of Meetings.

Written minutes shall be kept of all meetings of the Board of Directors. Such minutes may record the matter discussed and the action taken, but not the discussion of the matter. When action of the body is by motion, the minutes may state the name of the maker of a motion and shall contain a statement of the motion. The name of the seconder does not need to be recorded. Those Directors who vote against a motion may request to have their name and vote noted in the minutes. The chair or the Board of Directors may authorize a Director to briefly voice his or her position on a matter and/or have such position stated briefly in the record. The written minutes of such meetings, once approved, shall be the official and only record of such meetings. Notes, tapes or other records upon which such minutes are based shall be destroyed once the written minutes have been approved.

Section 7. Notice of Meetings.

A. Notice by Telephone, Telefax or Mailing.

Notice may be transmitted by telephone, telefax, electronic device, electronic mail, telegram or mail posted to the address of record for each member, and shall state the place, date, time and purpose of the meeting, and shall also indicate that it is being issued by or at the direction of the Board or the President. If the notice is sent by telegram, it shall be deemed received on the day it is delivered to the telegraph company; or if by mail, it shall be deemed received five (5) days after the postmark date.

B. Notice Unnecessary if the Meeting is Fixed by the Board.

Regular meetings of the Board of Directors may be held without notice if the dates, times and places of such meetings are fixed by the Board of Directors.

C. Special Meetings 15-Day Notice is Required.

Notice for special meetings, containing the dates, times, place and purpose of such meeting, shall be given to all Board members at least fifteen (15) days in advance of the date set for the meeting.

D. Waiver of Notice.

Notice is sufficient as to any Director who submits a signed Waiver of Notice, whether before, during or after the meeting, or who attends the meeting without protesting the lack of notice.

Section 8. Quorum of Directors.

After due notice has been provided to all Directors, one-third (1/3) of the Board (excluding Honorary International Directors and other Directors whose voting rights have been permanently or temporarily removed) shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. If a quorum is present when a meeting is convened, the quorum shall be deemed to exist until the meeting is adjourned, notwithstanding the departure of one (1) or more Directors. In the absence of a quorum at the beginning of the meeting, the President or a majority of Directors present may recess the meeting without notice until a quorum has been obtained, or the President may adjourn the

meeting. However, a quorum may be presumed unless the issue of a lack of a quorum is raised on a point of order immediately after the chair has called the meeting to order.

Section 9. Voting and Action by Directors at Meetings.

A. Voting.

Every Director who is present and voting at a Board meeting is entitled to one (1) vote only, even though the Director may attend such meeting in more than one (1) capacity.

B. Proxy Voting and Cumulative Voting are Prohibited.

(1) General Prohibition.

Proxy voting and cumulative voting are prohibited at any meeting of the Board of Directors.

(2) Exception for Chapter Presidents.

Notwithstanding Subsection B(1) above, a Director who sits on the Board by virtue of his position as Chapter President, and cannot personally attend a Board meeting, may authorize another member of his own local home or residence Chapter, not otherwise a member of the Board, to represent the Chapter at such meeting, and to vote on behalf of the Chapter on issues before the meeting. In the event the Chapter president for any reason cannot appoint and authorize another member of his own local Chapter to represent said Chapter at the Board meeting, that Chapter's board of directors may appoint and authorize such other member to represent the Chapter at the SCI Board meeting and, through the Chapter secretary, certify such appointment to the SCI Secretary. Where an individual is a member of more than one (1) SCI chapter, he or she may only be assigned and authorized to represent the Chapter in the geographic area in which his or her primary residence is physically located. If two (2) or more Chapters overlap in the area in which the member's primary residence is situated, the member will be required to attest by sworn affidavit as to which Chapter he or she is primarily affiliated. However, a Director may not sit as a voting member of the Board in some other capacity and assign his vote as Chapter President to another member of his Chapter.

C. Recording of Written Ballots.

If a vote is taken by written ballot, the Secretary shall record the specific matters placed before the Board for decision, the result, and shall attach thereto the ballots received.

D. Recording of Oral Votes.

If a vote is taken by ayes and nays at a meeting of the Board, the Secretary shall record in the minutes of the meeting such specific matters as were placed before the Board for decision and whether such measure was adopted or failed.

E. Action by Directors.

When a quorum is present, the vote of a majority of the Directors present shall be the act of the Board, unless a greater percentage of votes on any issue presented is required by these Bylaws, by applicable law or by the latest edition of Robert's Rules of

Order Newly Revised.

Section 10. Voting Without a Meeting Not Allowed Unless Unanimous Written Consent Obtained.

Action required to be taken at a Director's meeting may be taken without a meeting if the action is taken by all the Directors. The action must be evidenced by one (1) or more written consents describing the action taken, signed by each Director and included in the minutes filed with the corporate records reflecting the action taken. Action taken under this Section is effective when the last Director signs the consent, unless the consent specifies a different effective date. A consent signed under this Section has the effect of a meeting vote and may be described as such in any document. A Director may revoke a consent by delivering a signed revocation of the consent to the President or Secretary before the date the last Director signs the consent.

Section 11. Matters to be Considered at Directors Meetings.

A. Minutes of Meetings Recorded.

At each regular meeting of the Board of Directors, the minutes of the preceding meeting of the Board of Directors shall be read and approved (as corrected), unless the reading of the minutes is waived by the Directors present.

B. Treasurer's Report.

At each regular meeting of the Board of Directors, the Treasurer shall make a report of receipts, expenditures and of the financial condition of the Corporation.

C. Other Matters.

The Board of Directors may discuss such other matters as may be submitted for consideration to the President or Secretary from time to time.

ARTICLE VIII. CONDUCT OF OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, COMMITTEE MEMBERS, MANAGEMENT STAFF AND KEY PERSONNEL

Section 1. Duties.

All members of the Board of Directors and Officers owe a duty of loyalty, duty of care and a duty of good faith and fair dealing to SCI.

Section 2. Conflicts of Interest.

A. Conflicts of Interest Policy.

The Board of Directors shall adopt a conflicts of interest policy to protect SCI's interest when it is contemplating entering into a transaction or arrangement that might benefit the private interest of certain individuals, including members of the Board of Directors, Officers, members of Committees, SCI's management staff, SCI's key personnel and any other interested person. Such policy shall include, at a minimum, the procedures for disclosing a conflict of interest, determining whether a conflict of interest exists,

addressing the conflict of interest, the consequences of a violation of such policy and the requirement that members of the Board of Directors, Officers, members of Committees, SCI's management staff, SCI's key personnel and any other interested person provide an annual statement acknowledging and agreeing to abide by the policy.

B. Involved Officer or Director Counted for Quorum.

Any Officer or Director that has a potential conflict of interest in a transaction or arrangement to be considered by the Executive Committee or Board of Directors may be counted in determining the presence of a quorum at a meeting of the Executive Committee or Board of Directors where matters that may be a potential conflict are considered.

Section 3. Private Inurement Prohibited.

A. Use of SCI Property.

All real and personal property belonging to SCI is to be used only to further the exempt interests, activities and mission of SCI. No Officer, Director, member of a Committee, SCI's management staff, SCI's key personnel or any other person shall receive at any time any of the net earnings of SCI. This Section does not prohibit the Board of Directors from authorizing certain transactions between SCI and such persons, provided that such transactions are consistent with these Bylaws, conflicts of interest policy and any other conditions or limitations adopted by the Board of Directors.

B. Personal Business Interests.

No member of the Board of Directors or of any Committee may utilize his membership on such Board or Committee in such a way as to directly or indirectly benefit his personal business interests. There is no prohibition of Board members or Committee members from responding to requests from other members of the Board or Committee or members of SCI relating to his personal business, but he shall not utilize SCI letterhead or in any other way utilize his position as a member of the Board or Committee to directly pursue or seek business opportunities, within or outside of SCI, so long as he remains a member of the Board or Committee.

Section 4. Compensation Prohibited.

No elected Officer or Director of SCI shall be entitled to receive any compensation for his or her services to SCI in such capacity, but shall be entitled to reimbursements of expenses as authorized by the Board of Directors. Nothing herein shall prevent any Officer or Director from serving SCI in any other fully-disclosed capacity, and receiving compensation therefor, so long as the conflicts of interest policy has been followed.

Section 5. Oath of Office.

Every new Officer or Director, upon assumption of the duties and responsibilities of his new office, shall take an Oath of Office prescribed by the Board of Directors; however, this oath shall remain in effect during his continuous tenure in office, and shall be required only once during such continuous service on the Board or Executive Committee. The Oath of Office shall be printed on the inside cover of these printed Bylaws.

Section 6. Confidentiality.

Every member of the Board of Directors, in accordance with his duties to SCI, and any member of a Committee has a special responsibility to retain the security, restricted matter and internal confidences of SCI in order to protect the interests of the Corporation. In particular, but without limitation, confidentiality must be maintained as to matters discussed during executive sessions held pursuant to Article XIII; member lists; mailing lists; financial matters; Chapter matters; any other intellectual property to which SCI and/or the SCI Foundation has the rights; advocacy and fundraising plans; and other SCI sensitive matters. Every member of the Board of Directors, or a Committee, or staff member shall execute a confidentiality agreement as may be requested by SCI from time to time.

Section 7. Suspension or Removal of a Director or Officer of SCI.

The SCI Board of Directors has the power and authority at any time to suspend or remove any Officer or Director (each, a "Charged Party" for purposes of this Section) for cause by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board and to declare the office of such Charged Party vacant, except that the suspension or removal of a Charged Party under this Section pertains only to suspension or removal from office, not from the membership rolls, unless the Board specifically decides that the Charged Party shall also be removed from membership in SCI. The phrase "for cause" shall include, without limitation, one (1) or more of the following:

- (1) publication of any defamatory written or oral communication, either anonymously or signed, in regard to a member of SCI or staff of SCI or the SCI Foundation and which is not true or is otherwise defensible under the law of defamation in the State of Arizona;
- (2) failure to keep a confidence as required by these Bylaws;
- (3) violation of the duty of loyalty, duty of care or duty of good faith and fair dealing to SCI;
- (4) gross negligence or willful misconduct in failing to carry out or in carrying out the duties and responsibilities of an Officer or Director;
- (5) violation of the conflicts of interest policy described in Article VIII;
- (6) financial dishonesty (including, without limitation, misappropriation of SCI's or the SCI Foundation's funds or property) with respect to dealings with SCI or the SCI Foundation;
- (7) misconduct that has a materially adverse effect upon the purposes or reputation of SCI or the SCI Foundation; or
- (8) the conviction of, or plea of guilty or nolo contendere to, any felony or a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude or fraud.

Section 8. Procedure of Board of Inquiry for Removal of a Member, Director or Officer.

A. Authority.

The SCI Board of Directors has the power and authority at any time to suspend or remove any member, Officer or Director (each, a "Charged Party" for purposes of this Section) for those reasons defined in Article IV, Section 6(B)(2) with respect to members and Article VIII, Section 7 with respect to Officers and Directors by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board and to declare the office of such Charged Party vacant, except that the suspension or removal of a Charged Party under this Section pertains only to suspension or removal from office, not from the membership rolls, unless the Board specifically decides that the Charged Party shall also be removed from membership in SCI.

B. Initiation of Action and Notice.

An action for suspension or removal of a Charged Party may be initiated by (1) a petition signed by at least twenty (20) members of the Board of Directors, or (2) a resolution of the Executive Committee. Upon receipt of such petition or adoption of such resolution, the Executive Committee shall prepare a notice of charges to the Charged Party.

C. Board of Inquiry.

At the same time that a notice of charges is prepared, the Executive Committee shall convene a Board of Inquiry for that particular case. The Board of Inquiry shall consist of the chairman of the Past President's Council, one (1) Regional Representative, one (1) Director-at-Large, one (1) Chapter President, and one (1) member of the Ethics Committee. The Regional Representative, Director-at-Large, Chapter President and the member from the Ethics Committee shall each be selected by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Executive Committee. The Board of Inquiry shall elect its own chairman. All members of the Board of Inquiry shall be indemnified and held harmless for any action they take or decision they make in the course of carrying out their duties on the Board of Inquiry. The Board of Inquiry for each particular case shall be disbanded following its final report and recommendation to the Board of Directors.

D. Investigation.

The Board of Inquiry shall investigate the matters covered in the notice of charges. The investigation shall be undertaken in the same manner and under the same procedure as investigations by the Ethics Committee. The Executive Director shall supply qualified staff to assist and advise the Board of Inquiry.

E. Hearing.

The Charged Party shall have the right to a hearing before the Board of Inquiry, in person or telephonically, at which he may be represented by counsel. The time and place of the hearing shall be set by the Board of Inquiry with due regard to the convenience of the Charged Party and his counsel, but taking into account the nature of the charges, the schedule of Board meetings, and the need to act with appropriate

speed.

F. Board of Inquiry Report.

Following its investigation, the Board of Inquiry shall file a written report with the Board of Directors detailing its findings and making recommendations. The report shall be submitted to the Board of Directors at least thirty (30) days prior to a regularly scheduled Board meeting or a special meeting called for the purpose of considering the matter. A copy of the report shall be simultaneously provided to the Charged Party.

G. Response to Report.

The Charged Party shall have the opportunity to provide a written response to the report and recommendations of the Board of Inquiry. The response shall be provided to the Board of Directors as soon as it received by SCI. Telefax, electronic mail or other means of communication may be utilized.

H. Board of Directors Consideration.

At the regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors at which the notice of charges and the report of the Board of Inquiry are considered, the matter shall be heard in executive session. The Board of Inquiry shall provide an oral summary of its findings and recommendations, which may be supported by written or other materials. The Charged Party may be represented by counsel and shall have the opportunity to present an oral summary of his response, which may be supported by written or other materials. Equal time shall be allowed to the Board of Inquiry and the Charged Party, and up to two (2) hours shall be allowed for debate of the matter before the Board of Directors. The chair shall assure that equal time is provided for those on opposing sides of the matter, and shall limit debate to avoid repetitive or unnecessarily lengthy discussions. The chair may require that those who wish to speak to the matter request the floor in advance and be entered on a list of speakers. However, the Board of Inquiry and the Charged Party shall be allowed an opportunity to respond to points raised during the debate.

I. Resolution.

Following the close of debate, the chair shall ask if any person wishes to propose a resolution calling for suspension or removal. A resolution for suspension or removal may differ from the recommendations of the Board of Inquiry. The maker of any such resolution will be asked to state the resolution clearly, and the proposed resolution shall be displayed so that the Board may view it, or shall be reduced to writing and circulated. A second is required for the motion. The resolution shall be subject to amendment, which shall be proposed by a motion made and seconded and which may be adopted by majority vote. Debate shall be allowed on any motions to amend, but shall be limited to two (2) speakers in favor of each amendment and two (2) speakers opposed to each amendment. The chair may limit the time for debate. Once all motions for amendment have been decided, the resolution for suspension or removal shall be put to a vote without further debate. No points of order, motions to table, or similar motions shall be allowed, except a motion to question the existence of a quorum. A two-thirds (2/3) vote is required to adopt a resolution for suspension or removal of Charged Party.

J. Replacement.

If the Charged Party is suspended or removed, his position shall be considered vacated and the Board of Directors shall take appropriate action to fill the vacated position either temporarily or for the term of the suspension or permanently.

K. Publication.

A notice of the suspension or removal of the Charged Party may be published in accordance with the confidentiality provisions of these Bylaws.

ARTICLE IX. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Section 1. Executive Committee Membership.

A. Members.

The Executive Committee consists of the President, the President-Elect, the Deputy President-Elect (if any), the six (6) Vice Presidents, the President of the Sables, the Secretary, the Treasurer, and the Alternate.

B. The Alternate.

An Alternate member to the Executive Committee shall be elected by the Board of Directors for a one (1) year term by virtue of receiving the highest number of votes as candidate for the office of Vice President without having been elected to such position. The Alternate shall serve as an ex officio member of the Executive Committee with voice, but without vote. In the event a vacancy occurs in an office of Vice President, the Alternate shall automatically fill the vacancy and be elevated to the office of Vice President. Thereafter, the office of the Alternate need not be filled unless the Executive Committee determines otherwise, in which event, an election to fill the office of the Alternate shall be conducted at the next meeting of the Board of Directors following the occurrence of the vacancy.

Section 2. Oversight Responsibilities.

The Executive Committee operates as a managerial board within the Board of Directors and functions on behalf of the Board of Directors when the full Board is not in session. The Executive Committee shall exercise oversight responsibility over the activities of all Committees of SCI.

Section 3. Powers of the Executive Committee; Limitations.

A. Powers of the Executive Committee.

In operating as a managerial board within the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee shall exercise all the powers of the Board of Directors when the Board is not in session, except the responsibilities of the Board set forth in Subsection B below, which are prohibited and may not be exercised by nor be delegated to the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee may retain outside corporate legal counsel, and/or may utilize in-house legal counsel, to advise the Executive Committee, the Board of Directors, the Committees and the Executive Director.

B. Limitations of the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee may not:

- (1) Repeal or amend the Bylaws, nor adopt new Bylaws;
- (2) Fill vacancies on the Board of Directors;
- (3) Fix the compensation of Officers, Directors or key personnel of SCI;
- (4) Remove a Director, with or without cause;
- (5) Amend or repeal any resolution of the Board which by its terms shall not be amendable nor repealable;
- (6) Adopt and disseminate a fundamental change of view or basic policy of Safari Club International;
- (7) Purchase, sell, or mortgage real property of SCI valued in excess of \$100,000;
- (8) Adopt a corporate resolution recommending the sale, exchange or other disposition of all or substantially all the assets of SCI;
- (9) Authorize major construction with a value in excess of \$100,000;
- (10) Present a petition for judicial dissolution, nor adopt any plans of merger, or consolidation, or for nonjudicial dissolution; or
- (11) Authorize indemnification of any Officers, Directors or members of the Past President's Council, or employees.

Section 4. Election to Positions on the Executive Committee.

Elections to positions on the Executive Committee shall be governed by Article VI. Any vacancy on the Executive Committee may be filled in accordance with the provisions of Article VI, Section 3; or, in the case of the President of the Sables, by the Sables; or otherwise by the Board of Directors.

Section 5. Meetings of the Executive Committee.

A. Regular Meetings.

Regular meetings of the Executive Committee may be scheduled at any time and place fixed by the Executive Committee itself. Regular meetings may also be called by the President at his discretion.

B. Special Meetings.

A special meeting of the Executive Committee shall be called by the President at any time upon request in writing signed by a majority of the Executive Committee or by the President, at his discretion, stating the object of the proposed meeting.

C. Executive Session.

Any meeting of the Executive Committee may be held in executive session as set forth in Article XIV.

D. Records of Meetings.

Written minutes shall be kept of all meetings of the Executive Committee. Such minutes may record the matter discussed and the action taken, but not the discussion of the matter. When action of the Executive Committee is by motion, the minutes may state the name of the maker of a motion and shall contain a statement of the motion. The name of the seconder does not need to be recorded. Those who vote against a motion may request to have their name and vote noted in the minutes. The President or the Executive Committee may authorize a member of the Executive Committee to briefly voice his or her position on a matter and/or have such position stated briefly in the record. The written minutes of such meetings, once approved, shall be the official and only record of such meetings. Notes, tapes or other records upon which such minutes are based shall be destroyed once the written minutes have been approved.

Section 6. Notice of Meetings of the Executive Committee.

A. Notice by Telephone, Telefax, or Mailing.

Notice may be transmitted by telephone, telefax, telegram, electronic mail or mail posted to the address of record for each Committee member, and shall state the place, date, time of the meeting, and shall also indicate that it is being issued by or at the direction of the Executive Committee or by the President.

B. Notice Unnecessary if the Meeting is Fixed by the Executive Committee.

Meetings of the Executive Committee may be held without notice if the dates, times and places of such meetings are fixed by the Executive Committee.

C. Waiver of Notice.

Notice is sufficient as to any member of the Executive Committee who submits a signed Waiver of Notice, whether before, during or after the meeting, or who attends or participates in the meeting without protesting the lack of notice.

Section 7. Quorum.

Seven (7) members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. If a quorum is present when a meeting is convened, the quorum shall be deemed to exist until the meeting is adjourned, notwithstanding the departure of one (1) or more members of the Executive Committee. In the absence of a quorum at the beginning of the meeting, the President or a majority of the Executive Committee present may recess the meeting without notice until a quorum has been obtained, or the President may adjourn the meeting. However, a quorum may be presumed unless the issue of a lack of a quorum is raised on a point of order immediately after the President has called the meeting to order.

Section 8. Voting.

A. Proxy Voting Prohibited.

Proxy voting is prohibited at any meeting of the Executive Committee.

B. Action by Executive Committee.

When a quorum is present, the vote of a majority of the Committee members present shall be the act of the Executive Committee.

C. Action Without a Meeting.

In the event that it shall be necessary for the Executive Committee to carry out its business, and it is impractical for the Executive Committee to meet, then the President may direct the Secretary to poll all Executive Committee members by personal contact, mail, electronic mail, telephone or telefax on any specific matter or matters being placed before the Executive Committee; and the Secretary shall keep a permanent written record of the matters discussed and the numbers of votes cast for or against every matter voted upon.

ARTICLE X. SABLES

Section 1. SCI Division.

There shall be a Sables Division of Safari Club International. The Sables Division is a constituent part of Safari Club International having an autonomous Board of Directors, membership and set of Canons. Members of the Sables Division shall be considered SCI members for purposes of entry into the SCI Hunters Convention and entry of trophies into the SCI Record Book. Any SCI or SCIF Chapter may have a Sables Division. A person can be a member of the Sables Division of an SCI or SCIF chapter without having to be a member of SCI or of the SCI or SCIF chapter. A Sables Division is not considered a Sister Organization under any definition of such organization in these Bylaws.

Section 2. SCI Foundation Committee.

The SCI Foundation may form a Sables standing or special committee through which Sables members may further conduct their activities.

Section 3. Purpose.

Sables is a division of SCI committed to furthering the understanding of outdoor heritage, including the positive role of hunting, through the creation and support of wildlife and conservation educational programs that are consistent with the educational missions and purposes of SCI and the SCI Foundation.

Section 4. Officers.

The officers of the Sables are the President, the Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 5. Sables President.

The President of the Sables is also a member of the Board of Directors of SCI, the

Executive Committee of SCI, and the Board of Directors of the SCI Foundation.

Section 6. Governing Board.

The Governing Board of the Sables is the President, the Vice President, the Secretary, the Treasurer, the Three Directors and all of the Past Presidents of the Sables and Lionesses. The Governing Board of the Sables shall establish the membership dues payable by Sables members.

Section 7. Canons (Bylaws) of the Sables.

The Canons (Bylaws) of the Sables and any amendments thereto shall be complementary to and in consonance with the Bylaws of SCI.

Section 8. Membership in SCI.

The Sables Officers, Directors, Governing Board and Representatives must be members of SCI.

Section 9. Annual Reports of Sables Activities to SCI Board.

At least once each year, the Sables shall submit a written report regarding the activities of the Sables through the Secretary of SCI for presentation to the SCI Board of Directors at a regular meeting of the Board, or at such other time as requested by the SCI President. The Sables may make other written reports or recommendations through the SCI Secretary to the SCI Board of Directors or SCI Executive Committee at any time.

Section 10. No Conflicts.

All candidates for election as Sables Officers are required to complete questionnaires indicating that they do not have any employment conflicts nor conflicts of interest concerning SCI or the SCI Foundation, and indicating whether or not they have been convicted of any wildlife offense or of any felony.

ARTICLE XI. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Section 1. Terms of Employment.

The Board of Directors shall, in its sole discretion, employ an Executive Director at such rate of compensation as it shall determine necessary. The contract of employment shall be in writing, shall embody all of the terms and conditions of employment, and shall be approved by the Executive Committee and ratified by the Board of Directors at the regular meeting of the Board of Directors following execution of the contract.

Section 2. Ex Officio Member on Board and Executive Committee.

The Executive Director shall serve as an ex officio member of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee, without vote; however, he is not authorized to be present in any executive session without specific approval of the body.

Section 3. Operations Manager of Staff.

The Executive Director shall provide overall managerial direction and leadership to the staff of SCI and shall be responsible for the day-to-day administrative operations of the Corporation.

Section 4. Accountable to President, Executive Committee and Board.

The Executive Director shall be accountable and report to the President, the Executive Committee, and the Board of Directors, and shall assume such responsibilities and perform such duties as may be assigned by the President, the Executive Committee, or the Board of Directors [but not by individual members of such bodies].

ARTICLE XII. PAST PRESIDENTS' COUNCIL

Section 1. Members of the Council – Qualifications.

The Past Presidents' Council shall consist of all past Presidents of SCI and of the SCI Conservation Fund.

Section 2. Exemption from Dues.

Members of the Council shall not be required to pay dues, fees, nor any special assessments.

Section 3. Life Term on Council and Board.

The Past Presidents are automatically members of the Past Presidents' Council and of the SCI Board of Directors for life.

Section 4. Duties.

The Council and its individual members shall act in an ex officio advisory capacity to the Board, with vote.

Section 5. Notice of Meetings.

Notice of all meetings of the Board of Directors and of the Past Presidents' Council shall be sent to each member of the Council.

Section 6. Authority to Monitor Activities of SCI.

The Council has the authority to periodically review the condition, official acts, operations and objectives of SCI, and to make recommendations to the Executive Committee and Board of Directors.

Section 7. Review of Matters.

Whenever the Past Presidents' Council takes exception to any action or inaction of the Board of Directors or Executive Committee, or is otherwise dissatisfied with the response of the Board of Directors or Executive Committee, the Council may request the Board of Directors to review the matter. The concern shall be reduced to writing, and shall be presented to or served upon the Board of Directors as a formal complaint. The Board of Directors shall have ninety (90) days to respond to such complaint. If action taken by the Board of Directors on the complaint does not satisfy the Past

Presidents' Council, then the complaint, together with any response thereto taken by the Board, shall be forwarded to the Secretary within ninety (90) days of receipt of the response for the purpose of placing the matter on the agenda for the next regular meeting of the Board of Directors for reconsideration of the Board of Directors' action or failure to act.

ARTICLE XIII. STANDING AND SPECIAL COMMITTEES OF SCI

Section 1. Responsibilities of Committees.

The President or the Board of Directors shall assign responsibilities to the Committees that relate to the administration, conduct, regulation, or oversight of particular activities or special areas or endeavors of SCI.

Section 2. Appointment of Committee Chairmen and Members.

Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, members of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee or the general membership of SCI in good standing may be appointed by the President to the chairmanship (and to such other position on a Committee as authorized by these Bylaws) of such Standing or Special Committees as may be established, and shall serve at the President's pleasure or until their successors have been appointed and assume the duties of office. Once appointed, each chairman of a Standing or Special Committee shall select such vice-chairmen and members of the Committee as are necessary and appropriate to the work of the Committee, subject to the provisions of these Bylaws.

Section 3. Committees Advisory to Board and Executive Committee.

All of the Committees shall be advisory to the Board of Directors and to the Executive Committee.

Section 4. Staff Liaison Assigned to Committees.

Each Committee shall have staff liaison appointed by the Executive Director.

Section 5. Limitations on Powers of Committees.

No Standing or Special Committee of SCI shall exercise any powers prohibited to the Executive Committee pursuant to Article IX, Section 3, or any powers delegated to another Committee, unless otherwise directed by the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee or these Bylaws. No corporate authority may be delegated to any Committee unless all members of such Committee are members of the Board of Directors of SCI, and unless such Committee has been delegated such authority by a resolution adopted by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Committee Meetings.

A. Calling a Meeting.

The Committee chairmen, through their respective staff liaisons, are authorized to schedule committee meetings, and shall issue the official notice, stating the date, time,

place and purpose of such meeting. Any meeting of a Committee may be held in executive session as set forth in Article XIV.

B. Records of Meetings.

At the discretion of the Committee chairman, written minutes may be kept of meetings and, if kept, shall be submitted to the staff liaison assigned to the Committee for maintenance at the SCI offices. Such minutes may record the matter discussed and the action taken, but not the discussion of the matter. The written minutes of such meetings, if any, once approved, shall be the official and only record of such meetings. Notes, tapes or other records upon which such minutes are based shall be destroyed once the written minutes have been approved.

C. Quorum.

A majority of the members of a committee constitute a quorum of the committee, unless otherwise specified in these Bylaws.

Section 7. Standing Committees of SCI.

A. The Standing Committees are as follows:

- (1) Audit
- (2) Awards and Recognition
- (3) Bylaws and Resolutions
- (4) Canada
- (5) Convention
- (6) Compensation
- (7) Ethics
- (8) Finance and Investment
- (9) Governmental Affairs
- (10) International Affairs and Development
- (11) Membership and Chapter Development
- (12) Matching Grants
- (13) Nominating
- (14) Marketing and Communications

(15) Publications

(16) Trophy Records

(17) SCI Political Action Committee (SCIPAC)

B. Committee Composition and Responsibilities.

(1) Nominating Committee.

(a) Purpose.

The Nominating Committee shall be responsible for nomination of the Officers, the Regional Representatives, Directors-at-Large, International Directors, Honorary International Directors, the SCI Foundation Director-at-Large and other Directors eligible for election at meetings of the Board of Directors.

(b) Composition of the Nominating Committee.

The Nominating Committee shall be composed of seven (7) members; provided, however, that not more than one (1) member on the Nominating Committee may be elected from any single SCI region or area. Members of the Executive Committee, the President, President-Elect, Vice Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, the SCIF Director-at-Large, any other SCI or SCI Foundation officer, and staff personnel shall be ineligible to serve as regular or ex officio members of the Committee.

(c) Nomination for Election to the Nominating Committee.

Any person wishing to serve on the Nominating Committee must file a declaration of interest in being elected to the Nominating Committee with the Secretary no earlier than the Board meeting that precedes the Board meeting at which elections take place, and not later than thirty (30) days prior to the date of elections by the Board of Directors. The declaration, along with a brief biography and a photograph shall be published in the Official Journal at the same time as the Nominating Committee's report required in Article V is published. At the first regular meeting of the Board of Directors following the Annual Convention, the Board shall accept nominations from the floor for positions on the Nominating Committee to be elected from and by the Board, but only for any individual who has submitted a declaration of interest, as referred to in the first sentence of this provision. Following the close of nominations, each Director at the meeting shall receive a single ballot listing the nominees, on which he is entitled to cast not more than one (1) vote for each of the nominees.

(d) Nominees Voted on Together.

At the Board meeting, all nominees for election to the Nominating Committee shall be voted on together, with those receiving the greatest number of votes being elected to fill the vacancies. In case of a tie for the last vacancy, a run-off vote shall be conducted between the nominees tied.

(e) Nominating Committee Members Are Ineligible to Hold Any Office on the Executive Committee.

No person on the Nominating Committee shall be eligible to hold any office on the Executive Committee during his tenure on the Nominating Committee.

(f) Election of Chairman for and by the Nominating Committee.

At the first meeting after the members of the Nominating Committee have been elected, the members of the Committee shall elect a chairman from among the members of the Committee. The elected members of the Nominating Committee shall elect two (2) members of the Committee to serve a second term on the Nominating Committee. This election will take place prior to the Board meeting at which the elections shall take place, and the Committee shall promptly notify the Secretary of the Committee's election results.

(g) Members Serve One Year Term.

With the exception of the members elected for a two (2) year term, the members of the Nominating Committee shall be elected for a one (1) year term. No member may serve more than one (1) term on the Nominating Committee, unless at least one (1) full term has passed between the first term and the second term.

(h) Confidentiality of Nominating Committee Proceedings.

All deliberations and proceedings of the Nominating Committee shall be strictly confidential and no information on nominations shall be released to any person until the Nominating Committee files the report required in Article V. Each member of the Nominating Committee shall execute a confidentiality agreement as provided by SCI from time to time.

(2) Audit Committee.

(a) Audit Committee Membership.

The Audit Committee shall consist of five (5) members, one (1) appointed by the President who shall serve as the chairman and one (1) chosen by the Executive Committee, both of whom shall serve terms of one (1) year, and three (3) members elected by the full Board of Directors for staggered terms of three (3) years, one such member being elected each year at the first Board meeting following the Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors. No member of the Executive Committee is eligible to serve on the Audit Committee.

(b) Duties and Responsibilities of the Audit Committee.

(i) Recommend Selection of a Certified Public Accounting Firm. In consultation with the corporate Treasurer and Director of Finance, the Committee shall recommend to the Executive Committee the selection of a firm of Certified Public Accountants to make an annual audit of the affairs of SCI.

(ii) Review and Approve Reimbursement Vouchers. The Committee shall regularly review authorized vouchers submitted by Officers, Directors, Committee members, staff, or other officials of SCI as to their accuracy and conformance within the established policy regarding reimbursement of per diem or for expenditures.

(iii) Review Scope of Annual Audit.

The Committee shall review the overall scope of the annual audit, together with the results emanating from the auditing firm recommendations.

(iv) Report Audit Information to the Board.

The Committee shall review the internal financial controls of SCI, and the financial information prepared for publication to the members and the public; and regularly report relevant audit information to the Board of Directors at least fourteen (14) days prior to any meeting of the Board of Directors and to the Executive Committee at least fourteen (14) days prior to any meeting at which audit information will be discussed.

(c) Autonomy and Independence of Audit Committee.

The Committee shall operate in an autonomous manner, independently of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee, and the other Committees of SCI when performing the functions and assuming the responsibilities enumerated herein.

(3) Finance and Investment Committee.

(a) Composition.

The Finance and Investment Committee is composed of the President, the President-Elect, the Treasurer, and three (3) members of SCI who are not necessarily members of the Board, but who are trained or experienced in the business disciplines of finance or accounting; Provided however that no member of the Audit Committee may serve on the Finance Committee. The Chairman of the Board of Advisors of the SCIF 100 Hunter Legacy Fund shall be an ex officio member of the Committee, without vote, and the SCI Executive Director and the Director of Finance shall be ex officio staff members of the Committee, without vote.

(b) Duties and Responsibilities. The Committee shall:

- (i) Be responsible for the financial integrity of the corporation;
- (ii) Coordinate the annual budget process;

(iii) Be responsible, after consultation and close coordination with the Treasurer and the Director of Finance (who are members of the Committee) for deposit of SCI corporate funds in appropriate financial institutions;

(iv) Formulate a firm, decisive but discreet and conservative approach to cash management (taking into account interest rates on short and long term loans, on transaction fees, on liquidity and preservation of principal, etc.), as well as to other budget and fiscal considerations;

(v) Ensure compliance with budgetary constraints, fiscal limitations, and especially the regulatory mandates and guidelines relating to Sections 501(c)(3), (c)(4), and (h) of the United States Internal Revenue Code, as well as with all other relevant statutory/regulatory requirements of both domestic and foreign law;

(vi) Formulate, review, recommend and report to the Executive Committee and Board of Directors regarding corporate investment policy and various strategies to provide for a balance of quality, marketability and diversity of portfolio investments to ensure the preservation of principal and the availability of adequate funds for appropriate cash flow.

(4) Ethics Committee.

(a) Composition of the Committee.

(i) The Ethics Committee shall consist of no fewer than ten (10) members, at least one (1) of whom has experience as hunt booking agents or outfitters and at least two (2) of whom shall be members of the Executive Committee.

(ii) Each member of the Ethics Committee, excluding the chairman and vice chairman, shall have a term of three (3) years, except that such terms shall be staggered so that one-third of the Committee is replaced or reappointed each year, including the chairman and vice chairman. Any member of the Ethics Committee may be reappointed to a second consecutive term, but may not be appointed to a third or subsequent term unless at least one (1) full term has passed between the first two (2) terms and the third term. In the event that a member was appointed for less than a full term for one his first two terms, he may serve an additional term of the necessary length to come to a total of six consecutive years.

(b) Procedures of the Committee.

(i) No complaint shall be accepted by the Committee unless a written, signed and sworn statement has been filed in the matter. The Committee may initiate complaints at its discretion, based on any information that comes to the Committee's attention and that

amounts to a prima facie indication of a violation of the provisions of Article IV, Section 6(B)(1).

(ii) The Committee shall endeavor to process complaints expeditiously, within the bounds required for the full and fair consideration of each case before the Committee. The Committee shall prepare and maintain written internal working procedures for managing its caseload, handling of complaints, investigation and hearing procedures. These procedures shall be published at least once each year in the Official Journal for the information of the members of SCI. These procedures shall include the following elements:

-- The investigation of complaints shall normally be assigned by staff in a random matter, which does not preclude the assignment of different or additional investigators to the case by the chairman of the Committee for good cause, the addition of an investigator at the request of the assigned investigating team or the replacement of an investigator who has been recused;

-- All procedures of and communications from the Committee shall be based on the assumption that a respondent is considered innocent of the charges until such time as a final determination of a violation has been made in accordance with this Section; and

-- The investigators assigned to a case shall make a preliminary report to the Committee, prior to the transmission of the complaint to the respondent for reply, as to whether a prima facie case exists; if the Committee determines that no prima facie case exists, the complaint shall be returned to the complainant who shall be offered an opportunity to supplement the complaint; no complaint which has been returned shall thereafter be considered unless substantial and relevant new material is provided by the complainant.

(iii) Meetings of the Ethics Committee shall normally be in executive session, except that portions thereof that deal solely with procedural matters and do not deal with cases may be open, at the discretion of the chairman.

(iv) In the event that there is no sufficient mailing address for a respondent, a complaint may be sent via electronic means, according to procedures determined by the Ethics Committee.

(c) Confidentiality.

(i) All matters before the Ethics Committee, including the names of complainants and respondents, shall be held in the strictest confidence and shall not be revealed to or discussed with anyone

other than the members of the Committee, staff assigned to assist the Committee by the Executive Director, or a member of the Executive Committee, except as follows:

- Members of the Committee investigating matters before the Committee may disclose such information about such matters, including the names of the complainant and the respondent, as they deem necessary to the investigation;

- The chairman or vice chairman of the Committee, or a representative selected by the Committee, may disclose to the chairmen and members of the Awards Committee(s), the Nominating Committee, the Guides and Outfitters Committee, the Trophy Records Committee, and the Convention Committee, the names of respondents and essential details of pending cases; any committee chairmen and members who have received such information are bound by the confidentiality requirements of these Bylaws;

- The names of complainants and respondents in current or closed cases may be released to members of the Board, upon inquiry, along with information as to whether the case has been dismissed or is still pending;

- The chairman may disclose the details of any case in an executive session of the Board of Directors of SCI, either orally or in writing; if such disclosure is in the form of a written report, then all such reports shall be collected from all the members of the Board prior to the close of the executive session;

- The chairman, or counsel to the Committee at the chairman's direction, may disclose information to any member of SCI in relation to an open or closed case whenever it appears that the essential interests of SCI or SCI Foundation may be protected only through such disclosure; however, such disclosure requires prior approval of the Executive Committee;

- If a case is dismissed, the name of the complainant and the respondent may be released, upon inquiry by any member of SCI, along with the fact that the case has been dismissed;

- In a case in which action is taken against a member, a notice to that effect shall be published in the Official Journal unless, in the judgment of the Executive Committee, publication would be harmful to the interests of SCI. The notice may include such details as the name of the respondent and any business related to the interests of the members of SCI in which he is a principal owner or operator, along with a description of the matter for which the action was taken; this information may be released once

the action has become final and prior to publication of the notice; and

-- The staff liaison to the Ethics Committee may disclose to other staff such information as is necessary in order to enable other staff to carry out their functions properly to accomplish the purposes of these provisions and to protect the interests of SCI and its members; such other staff shall maintain that information in confidence.

(ii) All members of the Ethics Committee are bound by the confidentiality requirements of this subsection (c). Each member of the Ethics Committee shall execute a confidentiality agreement as provided by SCI from time to time. Any member found by the Ethics Committee to be in violation of the confidentiality requirements shall, upon approval by the Executive Committee, be summarily dismissed from the Ethics Committee and may be subject to further procedures for violation of the Sportsmen's Code of Conduct for breach of the confidentiality requirements.

(iii) Discussion of a case pending before the Ethics Committee by any person during a meeting of the Board of Directors is out of order and shall not be entertained, except when the Board is in executive session.

(iv) The official files for the Committee shall be maintained in a confidential manner at such place as directed by the Executive Director.

(v) Once a complaint has been filed with SCI, the rules of confidentiality set forth in these Bylaws apply to the complainant.

(5) Bylaws Committee.

The Bylaws Committee shall accept and review amendments, alterations, modifications, substitutions and other changes or revisions to the Articles of Incorporation or the Bylaws proposed by less than twenty-five (25) members of the Board of Directors, or any Committee, correcting them only as to form, grammar, language, and compatibility with the existing Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws, and purposes, objectives, practices and procedures of SCI. The Bylaws Committee shall submit its report and recommendations to the Executive Committee for recommendation to the Board of Directors for adoption. The Bylaws Committee also may, on its own motion, propose and recommend amendments, alternations, modifications, substitutions or other changes or revisions to the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws to the Executive Committee for adoption by the Board of Directors. The Bylaws Committee shall be the first body consulted in the interpretation these Bylaws in accordance with Article XXII.

(6) Governmental Affairs Committee.

(a) Composition and Staffing of the Committee.

The Committee shall consist of a chairman and several vice chairmen and such members as are appropriate. The vice chairmen of the Committee shall be: the vice chairman of the Governmental Affairs Committee, the chairman of the Legal Task Force, the chairman of the State Affairs Subcommittee and the chairman of SCIPAC. The Committee shall have a subcommittee designated as the State Affairs Subcommittee and may have other subcommittees. The Executive Director shall assign sufficient technically-competent personnel to staff the Committee. If SCI has retained lobbying or similar services from independent contractors, such contractors shall likewise be available to staff the Committee.

(b) Governmental Affairs Mission of SCI. The mission of SCI in governmental affairs is:

- (i) To support legislative efforts that enhance wildlife conservation;
- (ii) To protect the rights of hunters; and
- (iii) To assure through legislative and regulatory means the broadest possible enjoyment of hunting and access to hunting.

(c) Specific Objectives of SCI's Governmental Affairs Program. The specific objectives of SCI's Governmental Affairs program are:

- (i) To monitor and participate effectively in governmental activities at all levels, local, state/provincial, national and international; and
- (ii) To provide an active voice for hunters that is recognized as credible by governmental decision-makers.

(d) Responsibilities of the Governmental Affairs Committee.

(i) Planning and Budget.

The Governmental Affairs Committee, working in coordination with staff and contractors, shall prepare appropriate sections for the SCI long-range plan, shall develop programs, projects and relevant budgets to support them and to carry out its missions and the objectives set forth above. The long-range plan, programs and projects shall be approved by the Executive Committee during its deliberations on the budget.

(ii) Development of Positions.

The Committee shall be responsible for developing SCI's positions on legislative and regulatory issues. Such positions shall be drafted by staff, with input from any independent contractors that SCI may employ in this area and shall be debated by the Committee in regular or special meetings. Minutes shall be kept summarizing the debate and the conclusions of the Committee. The Committee shall report all adopted positions to the Executive Committee for approval prior to publication. Once a general position has been

adopted to support or oppose a given piece of legislation, the Committee shall have the authority to adopt strategies and to take actions consistent with that position. In the event of an emergency, such as the need to take a position to oppose or support an unanticipated amendment to a bill, the Committee has the authority to act so as to protect the interests of SCI in a manner consistent with the Bylaws and shall immediately inform the Executive Committee of any such emergency action.

(iii) Development and Delivery of Testimony and Comments of SCI.

The development of all testimony of SCI before all legislative bodies, and official comments to regulatory agencies and international bodies, shall be prepared by staff with input from any independent contractors that SCI may employ in this area, and shall be reviewed, modified, approved or rejected by the Committee and signed by the President of SCI. Such testimony or comments shall be delivered by the President of SCI or by any appropriate person on his behalf.

(iv) Committee Manual.

The Committee shall develop a manual describing its operations and procedures. The manual shall also be the place where the Committee records and retains its positions adopted on legislative and regulatory issues.

(7) Trophy Records Committee.

The Trophy Records Committee shall include a subcommittee on alternative hunting methods.

(8) SCI Political Action Committee (SCIPAC).

(a) Purpose.

The purpose of SCIPAC is to promote and strive for the improvement of government by encouraging the members of Safari Club International, who believe in the preservation of hunting, to take an active role in the promotion of sound principles of wildlife conservation through the electoral process. This mission is to be carried out at both the federal and state level in the United States for candidates for both federal and state offices.

(b) Duties.

SCIPAC shall function as a subcommittee of the Governmental Affairs Committee, and the chairman of SCIPAC shall sit as a vice chairman of the Governmental Affairs Committee. SCIPAC shall execute policy and shall make recommendations to the Governmental Affairs Committee regarding fundraising, support of candidates and efforts to defeat candidates and shall be governed by the decisions of the Governmental Affairs Committee.

(c) Members.

SCIPAC shall have eighteen (18) members, at least one (1) drawn from each of the following political regions of the United States: Northeast (including New England), Mid-Atlantic, Southeast, Midwest, South, Southwest (including Texas), West, California, and Pacific Northwest; plus the chairman, vice chairman, secretary and treasurer of SCIPAC, who shall be appointed by the President and shall serve at his pleasure. The Chairman of the Governmental Affairs Committee shall be an ex officio member of SCIPAC. The Executive Committee, in its discretion, may add additional members to SCIPAC. Any such action by the Executive Committee shall be reported to the SCI Board of Directors.

(d) Staff.

The Executive Director shall provide staff to administer the financial affairs of SCIPAC and to advise SCIPAC on political and election issues.

(9) Membership Committee.

(a) Composition and structure of the committee.

(i) The Membership Committee is composed of a Chairman who is appointed by the President of SCI, a Vice-Chairman who serves at the request of the Chairman, 7 Vice-Chairs, who are described below and as many members as deemed necessary by the Chairman in order to fulfill the Committee's mission and purpose.

(ii) The 7 Membership Vice-Chairs include:

(A) Chapter Awards- the Chairman of the Chapter Awards Committee sits on the Membership Committee as a Vice-Chair. This Vice-Chair serves at the request of the Membership Chairman. Duties of this Committee include establishing criteria, distributing nomination forms and determining winners for various Chapter Awards given at the SCI Annual Hunter's Convention and/or other SCI Events. Awards are given in order to recognize our Chapters for their outstanding contributions to SCI and the fight to retain our freedom to hunt.

(B) Chapter Presidents Chair and Vice Chair - the President of SCI and the President Elect of SCI are automatically appointed to these positions and preside over the Chapter President's Forums, which are held in conjunction with Board Meetings.

(C) International Development – the Chairman of the International Affairs and Development Committee automatically sits on the Membership Committee as a Vice-Chair. The Chairman of the International Affairs and Development Committee is appointed by the President of SCI, as this is a Standing Committee.

(D) Matching Grants – the Chairman of the Matching Grants Committee sits on the Membership Committee as a Vice-Chair. This Vice-Chair serves at the request of the Chairman of the Membership Committee and is appointed by the President of SCI. Duties of this Committee include establishing eligibility, criteria and an application process for matching funds for eligible Chapters who provide proof of supporting or conducting local projects, which contribute to the conservation, education and humanitarian goals of SCI.

(E) Regional Representatives – the Regional Representative Chair, who is elected by the Regional Representatives, automatically sits on the Membership Committee as a Vice-Chair.

(F) Sables Membership – the Chairman of the Sables Membership Committee, who is appointed by the Sables President, automatically sits on the Membership Committee as a Vice-Chair.

(G) Youth Activities – the Chairman of Youth Activities sits on the Membership Committee as a Vice-Chair. This Vice-Chair serves at the request of the Membership Chairman. The duties of Youth Activities include all related efforts and activities that stimulate youth membership.

(iii) Remaining Committee Members are appointed by the Membership Chairman.

(iv) The Chairman may establish sub-committees from the current members of the Membership Committee in order to better fulfill the Committee's responsibilities.

(b) Responsibilities of the committee.

The Membership Committee shall have the following responsibilities:

(i) To develop and implement membership growth, retention and enrichment programs.

(ii) To analyze member and Chapter needs in order to make recommendations for potential products, services, ideas and benefits.

(iii) To develop and implement Chapter development, service and growth initiatives throughout our global Chapter network.

(iv) To review information and assist SCI Chapters in complying with the requirements as listed in the SCI Bylaws and adopted by the SCI Board of Directors.

(v) To conduct an Awards Program for our Chapters, which will honor Chapters which encourage growth, support the programs, goals and mission of SCI.

(vi) To conduct the Matching Grant Program through which SCIF matches the money raised at the Chapter level for projects, which contribute to the conservation, education and humanitarian goals of SCIF.

(vi) To conduct a "President's Forum" in order to foster and improve communications between chapters and their membership, their Regional Representatives, the Executive Committee and the Board.

(vii) To provide leadership, support and guidance to Regional Representatives to improve, develop and expand chapter operations within their regions.

(viii) To assist other departments in accomplishing their goals whenever possible.

(10) International Affairs and Development Committee.

(a) Composition and Structure of the Committee.

(i) The Committee shall consist of no less than six (6) members, with at least three (3) of them being International Members of SCI.

(ii) The members of this Committee are appointed by the chairman of the Committee for a one (1) year term, and may be reappointed for an unlimited number of one (1) year terms.

(iii) A quorum of this Committee is four (4) members, and decisions are taken by a simple majority. A majority of those present when a quorum is present may decide all matters brought before the Committee.

(b) Duties and Responsibilities of the Committee. The Committee's duties and responsibilities shall be:

(i) Work to improve, enhance and expand SCI's international membership and international activities and resolve international issues affecting SCI;

(ii) Work to ensure the support of SCI's professional staff on all international issues affecting SCI;

(iii) Work to coordinate SCI's international activities with national and international non-government organization and with national and international agencies, conventions, treaties and governments; and

(iv) Work, to the extent practicable, with the SCI International Directors, Honorary International Directors and International Regional Representatives in carrying out its duties and responsibilities.

(11) Convention Committee.

The Convention Committee shall have a subcommittee called the Guides and Outfitters Subcommittee.

(12) Compensation Committee

(a) Purpose:

As representatives of the Board of Directors, the Compensation Committee has the power, duty and responsibility to determine the organization's overall compensation philosophy and to establish the guidelines, rules and procedures necessary for the proper and efficient administration of SCI's compensation program.

(b) Composition:

The Compensation Committee shall consist of five (5) members, including the President, who shall serve as chair, the President-Elect, the Treasurer, the immediate Past-President, and one Vice-President appointed by the President. The SCI Human Resources Director will serve as staff liaison on the committee.

(c) Duties:

(i) Set the overall compensation philosophy as recorded in the SCI Salary Guidelines, including review and amendments to the Salary Guidelines.

(ii) Set, monitor and review the base salary of the Executive Director and other members of executive management as set forth in applicable legislation.

(iii) Establish, monitor and determine accomplishment of variable pay award goals for the Executive Director and other applicable positions.

(iv) Review and approve any requests for variance to parameters established by SCI's Salary Guidelines.

(v) Review material modifications to existing benefits plans and make recommendations to the Executive Committee.

(13) Canada Committee

(a) The Canada Committee shall consist of:

(i) a Chairman, appointed by the President of SCI;

(ii) the President of SCI;

(iii) one member of the SCI Executive Committee appointed by the President of SCI;

(iv) the Executive Director of SCI;

(v) one Canadian chapter president from Eastern Canada, nominated by all the Canadian chapter presidents and approved by the Committee Chairman;

(vi) one Canadian chapter president from Western Canada, nominated by all the Canadian chapter presidents and approved by the Committee Chairman; and

(vii) one regional representative nominated by the Canadian regional representatives and approved by the Committee chairman.

(b) The Chairman of the SCI Governmental Affairs Committee and the Chairman of the SCIF Conservation Committee, or their designees, shall serve as ex-officio members of the Canada Committee.

(c) The Director of the SCI Canada Office shall serve as staff liaison to the Canada Committee and the Executive Director shall set up such other structures within staff to assist the Director of the SCI Canada Office as the Executive Director deems necessary.

(d) The Committee will meet face to face at least four times per year, two of which meetings must be in Canada, and as often as necessary by conference telephone call. It will have jurisdiction over all issues arising in relation to SCI Canada. It shall be responsible to assure coordination and consistency between SCI Canada and SCI and SCIF on all matters of policy and practice.

(e) The Chairman can establish subcommittees to deal with issues that are more strictly Canadian federal or provincial matters, such as questions of governmental affairs affecting hunters within the Canadian federal or provincial governments' jurisdictions or conservation of Canadian species of wildlife. Such subcommittees may consist largely or entirely of Canadian members of the Committee.

Section 8. Annual Reports of Committees.

At least once each year, each committee shall submit a written report through the Secretary of SCI for presentation to the Board of Directors at a regular meeting of the Board, or at such other time as may be requested by the President. Each Committee may make other written reports or recommendations through the Secretary to the Board or Executive Committee at any time.

Section 9. Special Committees.

The President or the Board of Directors may, from time to time, establish such Special Committees on an interim or ad hoc basis as either deems necessary to fulfill the objectives of SCI, and the President shall appoint the Chairman of each. Each Special Committee will report at such time and place as may be specified by the President or the Board of Directors, and will be dissolved by the President upon completion of its work and the filing of its final report. In the case of a committee established pursuant to this section by a President, that committee shall be considered to have been dissolved at the end of the term of that President, unless his successor specifically extends the mandate of the committee, on the record of an Executive Committee meeting or a meeting of the Board of Directors. The succeeding President may appoint a new chairman of the committee in question, and may modify its mandate.

ARTICLE XIV. EXECUTIVE SESSIONS

Section 1. Authority.

Any meeting of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee, or any Committee of SCI, may be held in executive session, open only to the members of the body holding an executive session and those staff or visitors invited to remain. Executive sessions may be declared by the chairman of the body or upon motion of the body. Matters relating to personnel, matters being considered by the Ethics Committee, and matters

relating to litigation or obtaining legal advice shall normally be discussed in executive session.

Section 2. Actions Taken Have Full Force and Effect.

When the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee or any Committee of SCI meets in executive session, that body is empowered to make all decisions that it can make in regular session. The only difference between executive session and regular session shall be the restriction on those who can be present and participate in the discussion, the purpose being to protect the confidentiality of such discussions. Actions taken and decisions made in executive session do not have to be acted on in a regular session in order to have full force and effect but will be recorded in the minutes of the meeting.

Section 3. Records of Meetings.

Arrangements shall be made by the chairman of the relevant body to take minutes of the issues raised and the decisions made during an executive session, but no record shall be made of the discussions.

Section 4. Attendance by Staff or Visitors.

The chairman of the relevant body may request staff or visitors to be in attendance at an executive session to take minutes, to provide essential information, or for other purposes.

Section 5. Confidentiality.

All persons attending an executive session shall keep all matters discussed in executive sessions strictly confidential. The minutes of executive sessions shall be kept confidential, except from members of the body that met in executive session and members of the Board of Directors, and except as otherwise required by law and these Bylaws. If the executive director attended the executive session, the minutes of the portion of the meeting attended by the executive director may be made available to him. If the executive director or a staff member is needed to carry out an action taken in executive session, the minutes should specify such person either by name or position and should reflect that the chair of the meeting has been charged with notifying the affected person and later reflect that the charge was carried out.

ARTICLE XV. CHAPTERS

Section 1. SCI Jurisdiction Over Chapters; Definitions.

A. All SCI Chapters must operate pursuant to these Bylaws and within the rules, regulations, guidelines and directives established by the SCI Board of Directors.

B. The phrase “national chapter” means a chapter composed substantially of members that reside within the United States. The phrase “international chapter” means a chapter composed substantially of members that reside outside the United States.”

Section 2. Annual Chapter Contributions to the SCI General Fund.

Each Chapter is required to conduct at least one (1) fund-raiser per year, and to donate thirty percent (30%) of the net proceeds from the Chapters' and from each of its Sister Organizations' (as defined in Section 8(B)(3) below) largest net income fund-raising project to the SCI General Fund; however such amount shall not be less than \$2,000 each year, except that there shall be no minimum requirement for chapters in their first year of existence. The objective is to encourage Chapters to be more than just a social group. If, for any reason, a Chapter is unable to conduct a fund-raiser in a given year, a \$2,000 minimum contribution to the SCI General Fund will fulfill the Chapter's financial obligation to the international organization for that year. The Board of Directors may authorize international chapters to adopt such alternative methods as necessary for complying with this provision. If a Chapter (or the Sister Organization) has been granted tax-exempt status by the United States Internal Revenue Service under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, then the contributions of the 501(c)(3) organizations which are required hereunder shall be paid to the SCI Foundation General Fund. In addition, Sables Divisions within Chapters are also required to contribute thirty percent (30%) of the net proceeds from their largest fundraiser to either the Sables Division of Safari Club International or to the Sables Committee of the SCI Foundation. There is no minimum dollar requirement for such contribution.

Section 3. Member of Board and Attendance at SCI Board Meetings.

A. General.

The President [or other designated representative] of each Chapter is a member of the Board of Directors by virtue of his position within the Chapter. Action may be taken against the President [or other designated representative] of the Chapter as an individual for his individual acts or omissions and/or such President [or other designated representative] of the Chapter may be removed from the Board of Directors as set forth in Section 5 below.

B. Attendance at Board Meetings.

The President [or other designated representative] of each national Chapter and the international chapters in Canada or Mexico is required to attend and participate in at least one (1) SCI Board meeting each year.

C. Attendance at Board Meetings by International Chapters Other than Those in Canada and Mexico.

International Chapters other than those in Canada and Mexico are required to have a representative attend and participate in at least one (1) SCI Board meeting each year, but may apply to the President, Executive Committee or Board of Directors to be excused for good cause from this attendance requirement, including considerations of time, distance and costs involved. All Chapters should realize that active involvement of leaders in Board functions is a key to Chapter involvement in all SCI programs and activities and the achievement of SCI purposes and objectives.

Section 4. Chapter Requirements.

A. Mission requirements.

Each Chapter of SCI is required to demonstrate that it acts in support of the missions

and objectives of SCI. Evidence of support of the mission and objectives of SCI can be shown, for each national Chapter and each international chapter in Canada or Mexico, by doing three (3) or more of the following, and for each International Chapter, other than those in Canada or Mexico, by doing one (1) or more of the following:

- (1) participating in legislative, judicial, regulatory, public relations or other advocacy activities in order to protect the freedom to hunt and to advocate hunting and hunters;
- (2) engaging or participating in projects that educate the public, and particularly youth, about the constructive role of hunting and hunters in society, which may include the granting of scholarships to SCI and the SCI Foundation educational programs and for other purposes;
- (3) engaging or participating in projects for the conservation of wildlife, on either a local, regional, national or international scale, including wildlife research, wildlife management and other projects that assist in the collection and dissemination of information on wildlife populations;
- (4) participating in humanitarian activities that demonstrate the constructive role of hunters in society; or
- (5) making a financial contribution to SCI or the SCI Foundation, as established by resolution of the Executive Committee or Board of Directors, beyond the contribution required in Section 2 above, for the purpose of supporting mission activities.

B. Chapter Meetings.

Each Chapter must meet the legal requirements of the jurisdiction in which it is located for the minimum number of meetings for an incorporated, non-profit entity, and must hold such additional meetings as may be required by the Executive Committee or the Board of Directors.

C. Annual Report.

- (1) Each national Chapter shall file an annual report with the Executive Director. The annual report shall be in the format and contain the information required by the Executive Committee. The annual report shall be due on January 31.
- (2) The Executive Committee shall set the date, format and informational requirements for the filing of annual reports by international Chapters.

D. Chapter Bylaws.

Each SCI Chapter shall adopt its own set of Bylaws, not inconsistent with the SCI Bylaws. A copy of the Chapter Bylaws and any amendments, alterations, substitutions or other revisions or changes thereto shall be filed with the Executive Director upon their adoption.

E. Fiscal Year.

Each Chapter shall establish either a fiscal year ending on March 31, June 30, September 30 or December 31.

F. Tax-Exempt Status.

National chapters and any other Chapter subject to the jurisdiction of the United States may seek exemption from federal income taxes under the United States Internal Revenue Code by either electing to be covered by the exemption available to SCI Chapters under SCI's group exemption under the Section 501(c)(4) determination letter, or by applying for exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Each Chapter seeking exempt status under SCI's group exemption under the Section 501(c)(4) determination letter must submit to SCI all documents and information necessary to file with the Internal Revenue Service to obtain such status, including authorization by the Chapter for SCI to add the Chapter to the group exemption. International Chapters may choose to apply for tax-exempt status pursuant to the laws of their respective governments.

G. Minimum Active Chapter Membership.

Chapters shall maintain an active Chapter membership of not less than twenty-five (25) members, exercising continuing effort to increase the membership, provided that, for international Chapters, the Executive Committee or the Board of Directors may establish a lesser number of active members to be maintained by such Chapter.

Section 5. Right to Vote, Quorum Count.

A. Evidence of Compliance with Requirements.

(1) Any Chapter that has not provided the Executive Director with written evidence of compliance with the requirements set forth in Subsection C below, at least sixty (60) days prior to a regular or special meeting of the SCI Board of Directors shall be notified, followed promptly with written notice if initial notice made orally, by the fastest possible means, including electronic mail, of that fact and, if that Chapter does not come into compliance within thirty (30) days prior to such meeting, the representative of such Chapter may be temporarily removed from the Board of Directors. Furthermore, the representative of that Chapter, if so removed, shall not be counted in determining whether a quorum is present under Article VI, Section 8. Such notice shall simultaneously be provided to the chairman of the Membership and Chapter Development Committee and the Regional Representative for that Chapter.

(2) The written evidence required by Subsection A(1) above does not need to be resubmitted prior to each meeting of the SCI Board of Directors unless there has been a material change in any such information.

B. Reinstatement.

When the representative of the Chapter has been temporarily removed under Subsection D below, the right to vote shall be automatically reinstated when the Executive Director certifies that the appropriate written evidence of compliance has been received. However, such reinstatement shall be valid only for subsequent meetings of the SCI Board of Directors.

C. Requirements.

The requirements for which written evidence must be received are the following:

- (1) for national Chapters, maintaining an active Chapter membership of not less than twenty-five (25) members;
- (2) submitting to the SCI (or SCI Foundation) general fund the annual Chapter contribution of 30% of the net proceeds from the Chapter's and Sister Organization's largest net income fund raising project, or the \$2,000 minimum payment described in Section 2, above;
- (3) filing the required annual report to SCI;
- (4) for national Chapters that have a Federal tax-exempt status, filing a copy of the completed IRS Form 990, whether or not the filing of such Form 990 is required by law;
- (5) for Chapters seeking to obtain or maintain federal tax-exempt status under SCI's group exemption under the Section 501(c)(4) determination letter, filing all documents and information necessary to file with the Internal Revenue Service to obtain or maintain such status; and
- (6) submitting a signed copy of SCI's sublicensing agreement that governs the use, and consideration for such use, of any Intellectual Property (defined in Section 8 below).

D. Suspension.

After the expiration of the thirty (30) day period referred to in Subsection A, above, the Membership and Chapter Development Committee shall decide whether the representative of such Chapter shall be temporarily removed from the Board of Directors. In considering such removal, the Membership and Chapter Development Committee may waive one (1) or more of the requirements in Subsection C (1), (2) or (3), above.

E. Continuous Non-Compliance.

If the Chapter's representative has been temporarily removed and not reinstated within six (6) months of the removal, then on the recommendation of the Executive Committee, the charter of the Chapter may be revoked by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Board of Directors at a meeting of the Board of Directors occurring after the six (6) month period.

Section 6. Establishment of New Chapters.

A. By the Board of Directors.

New Chapters may be established at any regular meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority vote, except as provided in Subsection B below. The Board of Directors shall establish the relevant rules, regulations and authorizations pertaining to the establishment of new SCI Chapters and the geographic locations or areas in which all SCI Chapters shall be formed, shall actively operate and have jurisdiction.

B. By the Executive Committee.

New Chapters may be established between regular meetings of the Board of Directors by a majority vote of the Executive Committee, provided that such new Chapters conform to the rules and regulations adopted by the Board of Directors pursuant to Subsection A above. All Chapters established in this manner shall be subject to review and ratification by the Board of Directors at the next regular or special meeting of the

Board.

Section 7. Suspension or Revocation of Chapter Charters.

The charter of a Chapter may be suspended or revoked by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the full SCI Board of Directors for any act or situation deemed detrimental, damaging or injurious to SCI.

Section 8. Use of Intellectual Property.

A. Sublicensing Agreement.

Each Chapter shall sign a sublicensing agreement with SCI governing the use, and consideration for such use, of any emblem, name, logo, trademark, member list, donor list, mailing list or other intellectual property to which SCI and/or the SCI Foundation has the rights (collectively, "Intellectual Property"), whether or not such Intellectual Property is formally registered with United States or other authorities, national or international. Sables Divisions within Chapters may use SCI or SCI Foundation's Intellectual Property subject to the terms and conditions of the Chapter's sublicensing agreement.

B. Limited Use.

- (1) No Chapter shall have any right to the use of Intellectual Property except pursuant to such a sublicensing agreement.
- (2) Each Chapter that has signed such a sublicensing agreement shall be entitled to use Intellectual Property so licensed, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the sublicense, as long as the sublicensing agreement remains in force.
- (3) No Chapter shall have the right to further sublicense the right to use Intellectual Property to any individual or entity, including, without limitation, any organization that, directly or indirectly contributes to; has the same membership of; has been created by; adheres to the same or similar missions, purposes or objectives as; controls, is controlled by, under common control with or is otherwise affiliated with the Chapter (each, a "Sister Organization"). Any Sister Organization seeking to use Intellectual Property must enter into a sublicensing agreement with SCI, which shall govern the authorized use and consideration for such use by such Sister Organization.

C. Termination of Sublicense Agreement.

Upon final determination of the revocation of a Chapter's charter, withdrawal of a Chapter, dissolution of a Chapter, any other direct or indirect termination of a Chapter's relationship with SCI, or as otherwise specified in the sublicensing agreement, that Chapter's (and any Sister Organization's, if applicable) sublicensing agreement shall terminate and thereafter become null and void and such Chapter (and any Sister Organization, if applicable) shall immediately cease all use of Intellectual Property. If the charter of a Chapter is suspended, the Executive Committee shall decide whether or not to leave the sublicensing agreement in effect during the period of suspension.

Section 9. Transfer of Chapter Membership -- Approval of the Gaining Chapter.

A member may transfer from a Chapter to another with the approval of the Board of Directors of the gaining Chapter. Annual Chapter dues shall be prorated on a monthly basis between such Chapters for the year of transfer.

Section 10. Membership Essential Component of Membership in a Chapter.

A. No individual or other entity shall be eligible for membership in a Chapter unless such individual or entity is also a member of SCI. Exception is made for members of Sables Divisions within Chapters who qualify for membership as a Sable according to the Canons of the Sables. Such Sables members shall be considered SCI members for purposes of entry into the SCI Hunters Convention and entry of trophies into the SCI Record Book.

B. Membership Classes or Categories.

A Chapter may not have or create other classes or categories of membership that are inconsistent with the classes and categories of membership adopted by the SCI Board of Directors and may not have life members unless the member is also a life member of SCI.

C. Chapter Fees Determined by Chapter.

Initiation fees, dues, and special assessments for membership in each Chapter shall be determined by the Board of Directors of such individual Chapter and collected and distributed pursuant to rules and regulations adopted by the SCI Board of Directors.

D. Non-Dealing with Suspended or Revoked Members.

A Chapter shall honor and carry out, insofar as possible, all sanctions issued by the Ethics Committee and approved by the Executive Committee or Board of Directors. A Chapter shall have no further SCI dealings whatsoever with a member of SCI whose membership has been revoked pursuant to Article IV, Section 6 or Article VIII, Section 8. In like manner, a Chapter shall also have no dealings whatsoever with a member whose membership has been suspended pursuant to Article IV, Section 6 or Article VIII, Section 8, during the period of suspension. The term "no dealings" includes, without limitation, allowing such a suspended or terminated member to: be a member of the Chapter; to hold office in the Chapter; to advertise or sell goods and services, either directly or indirectly, at a Chapter function or activity; or to sponsor, donate or otherwise participate in Chapter functions and activities, either directly or indirectly.

E. Noncompliance by Chapter Grounds for Revocation of Charter.

Failure of a Chapter to comply with any of the provisions of this Section 10 shall be grounds for revocation of the Chapter charter.

ARTICLE XVI. RULES OF ORDER

Section 1. Parliamentary Authority.

The procedures set forth in the latest edition of "Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised" shall govern the meetings of Special and Standing Committees of SCI, the Past

President's Council, the Governing Board and members of the Sables, the Board of Directors and Executive Committee, unless specific exceptions are otherwise specified in these Bylaws and except in meetings conducted by telephone conference calls.

Section 2. Parliamentarian.

The President may appoint an official Parliamentarian of SCI, who shall be a member of Safari Club International, and who shall serve at the pleasure of the President.

ARTICLE XVII. AMENDMENTS TO THE ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OR THE BYLAWS

Section 1. Amendments by the Board of Directors.

The Board of Directors is authorized to amend, alter, modify, substitute or otherwise revise or change the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of SCI by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of Directors present at a regular meeting or special meeting called for such purpose.

Section 2. Procedure for Adoption.

A. Conditions for Consideration.

- (1) The Board of Directors shall consider for adoption any proposed amendment, alteration, modification, substitution or other revision or change to the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws that has been proposed in a writing signed by at least twenty five (25) members of the Board of Directors.
- (2) Except as set forth in Section 2(a)(1) above, prior to consideration by the Board of Directors for adoption, any proposed amendment, alteration, modification, substitution or other revision or change to the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws must have been approved by the Bylaws Committee and the Executive Committee in accordance with the procedures set forth Subsections B and C below.

B. Bylaws Committee Approval.

- (1) The Bylaws Committee may initiate any proposed amendment, alteration, modification, substitution or other revision or change to the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws by submitting such proposal to the Executive Committee for consideration.
- (2) Any proposed amendment, alteration, modification, substitution or other revision or change to the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws may be initiated by a request for consideration delivered to the Bylaws Committee in writing and signed (a) by one or more members of the Board of Directors, or (b) by any Committee. Within sixty (60) days of receipt of such request for consideration, the Bylaws Committee shall meet and review the proposal. The Bylaws Committee may revise such proposal only to the extent necessary to correct it as to form, grammar, language and compatibility with the existing Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, and purposes, objectives, practices and procedures of SCI.

Within sixty (60) days after the Bylaws Committee meeting, the Bylaws Committee must submit to the Executive Committee the text and version of the proposal originally submitted to it, the revised version of the proposal and its recommendations as to whether or not such proposal should be approved or rejected.

C. Executive Committee Approval.

The Executive Committee shall consider any proposed amendment, alteration, modification, substitution or other revision or change to the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws submitted to it by the Bylaws Committee within forty-five (45) days of receipt of such proposal. Upon the affirmative vote of a majority of the Executive Committee, the Executive Committee shall submit such proposal to the Board of Directors for consideration at the Board of Directors next regular meeting or a special meeting called for such purpose. If such affirmative majority vote is not obtained, the Executive Committee shall return the proposal to the Bylaws Committee for further consideration. Within sixty (60) days of receipt of a returned proposal, the Bylaws Committee shall either (a) further revise the proposal and resubmit the proposal to the Executive Committee pursuant to this Section; or (b) return the proposal to the group that initiated the proposal for further action by such group.

D. Notice to the Board of Directors.

Any proposed amendment, alteration, modification, substitution or other revision or change to the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws that has been submitted in a writing signed by at least twenty-five (25) members of the Board of Directors or approved as required in Subsection A(2) above must be submitted in writing by mail to every member of the Board of Directors not less than thirty (30) days, but not more than sixty (60) days, prior to the meeting at which it will be considered or must have been published in the Official Journal not less than thirty (30) days, but not more than sixty (60) days, prior to the meeting of the Board of Directors at which it will be considered.

E. Germane Amendment.

Notwithstanding the notice to be provided herein, proposals for revisions or changes that are germane to any proposed amendment, alteration, modification, substitution or other revision or change to the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws may be made from the floor at the Board of Directors meeting.

F. Copies of Proposed Amendments.

Any member of the Board of Directors may request and will receive a full copy of proposed amendment, alteration, modification, substitution or other revision or change in sufficient time prior to the meeting at which they are to be considered by requesting same from the Secretary at SCI Headquarters in Tucson, Arizona.

G. Member Approval Not Required.

Member approval is not required to effectuate any amendment, alteration, modification, substitution or other revision or change to the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws. At the Board of Directors' sole option, before exercising its discretion in adopting or rejecting a

proposed amendment, alteration, modification, substitution or other revision or change to the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws, it may submit to the members such proposal for the purpose of obtaining input from the members to determine whether or not a majority of the members would be in favor thereof.

Section 3. Publication upon Adoption.

Within sixty (60) days after adoption by the Board of Directors, the amended, altered, modified, substituted or otherwise revised or changed portion of the Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws shall be published in the Official Journal.

ARTICLE XVIII. FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of SCI shall begin on July 1 and shall end on June 30.

ARTICLE XIX. AUTHORITY TO EXECUTE CONTRACTS OR OTHER LEGAL INSTRUMENTS

Section 1. Authority to Execute.

No person shall have any authority to expend any corporate funds nor legally bind the Corporation by any contract or other legal instrument unless so authorized under these Bylaws or by specific authorization of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Authorization.

In addition to authorization provided under these Bylaws, the Board of Directors may authorize any Officer or agent of SCI to execute and deliver any binding contract or other legal instrument or note in the name of SCI; and the Board may otherwise delegate such other representational authority deemed necessary, whether such delegation authority is general or limited to certain specific instances.

ARTICLE XX. INDEMNIFICATION, INSURANCE AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

Section 1. Protection of Officers, Directors, and Committee Members.

No Officer, Director, or Committee member of SCI shall be held legally and personally liable for monetary damages for a breach of fiduciary duty in their individual official capacities, except to the extent that the breach is the result of gross negligence or willful misconduct, unless such exemption for liability or limitation thereof is not permitted under law.

Section 2. Indemnification.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, SCI shall indemnify and hold harmless each of its

Officers, Directors, and Committee members, and any individual that served as an Officer, Director or Committee member of SCI, that is made or threatened to be made a party to an action, suit or proceeding by reason of the fact that he or she is or was an Officer, Director or Committee member of SCI. The indemnification provided by this Section shall not be deemed to be exclusive of any other rights to which any person may be entitled apart from this Section.

Section 3. Limitation of Liability.

Notwithstanding any other provision hereof, the debts, obligations and liabilities of SCI shall be solely the debts, obligations and liabilities of SCI; and no Officer, Director, or member of any Committee shall be obligated personally for any such debt, obligation or liability of SCI solely by reason of being or serving as an Officer, Director or Committee member.

Section 4. Insurance.

The Board of Directors shall have the power to purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of SCI, the Officers, Directors, Committee members, employees or agents of SCI and to provide any other potential indemnities at the expense of SCI, against any liability asserted against or incurred by them in any capacity, whether or not SCI would have the power to indemnify such persons against such liability under the provisions of these Bylaws.

Section 5. Effect of Subsequent Modification or Repeal.

Any subsequent modification or repeal of this Article shall not adversely affect any right or protection existing prior to such modification or repeal.

ARTICLE XXI. DISSOLUTION OF THE CORPORATION

Section 1. Property and Assets of SCI Conveyed by Gift to Similar Tax-Exempt Organization in Event of Dissolution.

Upon liquidation, discontinuance, dissolution, or abandonment of the Corporation, all of the property and assets of SCI shall be transferred or conveyed by the Board of Directors by way of gift to one (1) or more domestic or foreign corporations, or foundations, associations, societies or organizations that are exempt from both federal and state income taxes and property taxation under Section 501 (c)(3) or (c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code of the United States of America, and are engaged in activities substantially similar to those of SCI. Such transfer or conveyance shall be accomplished in accordance with the laws of the State of Arizona [State of Incorporation] that pertains to the liquidation, dissolution, or abandonment of such corporations.

Section 2. No Transfer To Any Person Except For True Value On Competitive Bid Approved by the Board.

In no event shall any of the properties or assets of SCI be conveyed or transferred to any person upon the liquidation, dissolution or the abandonment of the Corporation,

except for good and valuable consideration at fair market value, upon competitive bid, and only upon approval of the Board of Directors.

Section 3. Appointment of Successor Trustee.

In such event of dissolution, and in the further event of an existing trust indenture wherein the Corporation is Trustee, and there remain any unperformed duties or funds due for payment by the Corporation under a trust provision, and such Trust Agreement does not contain a provision giving the Corporation power to appoint a successor trustee upon dissolution, the Corporation is authorized to make application to any court of competent jurisdiction in the State of Arizona, [State of Incorporation], or in any other state designated by the trust indenture, for the appointment of a successor trustee to administer such fund.

ARTICLE XXII. INTERPRETATION OF BYLAWS

Section 1. Interpretation According to Arizona Law.

In the event of a conflict of laws or difference in the interpretation of terms, the provisions of these Bylaws shall be determined according to the laws and legal interpretation of the State of Arizona [State of Incorporation].

Section 2. Interpretation by Bylaws Committee.

In the event that an Officer, Director or member of a Committee seeks a determination of the construction of a provision of these Bylaws, the provision shall first be submitted to the Bylaws Committee for review and interpretation, such interpretation to be consistent with the intent of the Board in enacting these Bylaws and with applicable law. The Bylaws Committee shall submit to the President a written summary of its interpretation of the provision, which shall be maintained with the Corporation's records. The Board of Directors shall have the ultimate authority to determine the construction of a provision of these Bylaws, provided that such determination is consistent with Arizona law.

Section 3. Masculine and Singular Terms Include Feminine and Plural Terms.

The pronouns and relative words used in these Bylaws are written in the masculine and singular; however, such words shall be interpreted to also include female and plural. Membership of both sexes in SCI is both enthusiastically and publicly encouraged.

Section 4. Titles.

Titles to sections or subsections are for identification purposes only and are not a substantive part of these Bylaws.

SCI HUNTERS CODE OF ETHICS

Recognizing my responsibilities to wildlife, habitat and future generations, I pledge:

- To conduct myself in the field so as to make a positive contribution to wildlife and ecosystems.
- To improve my skills as a woodsmen and marksman to ensure humane harvesting of wildlife.
- To comply with all game laws, or the sport of fair chase, and to influence my companions accordingly.
- To accept my responsibility to provide all possible assistance to game law enforcement officers.
- To waste no opportunity to teach young people the full meaning of this code of ethics.
- To reflect in word and behavior only credit upon the fraternity of sportsmen, and to demonstrate abiding respect for game, habitat and property where I am privileged to hunt.
