Dear Chairman Bishop and Ranking Member Grijalva:

The U.S. Chamber of Commerce, the world's largest business federation representing the interests of more than three million businesses of all sizes, sectors, and regions, as well as state and local chambers and industry associations, and dedicated to promoting, protecting, and defending America's free enterprise system, supports H.R. 538, the "Native American Energy Act."

The Chamber established the Native American Enterprise Initiative (NAEI) in recognition of the revolution in entrepreneurship occurring by Indian tribes and amongst the nearly three million people of American Indian and Alaskan Native heritage. Grounded in Indian self-determination, additional strides can be made in economic development.
