## **Bio of Witness Kevin Day**

***Kevin Day, Chairman.*** Kevin Day has held the office of Tribal Chairman for the Tuolumne Me-Wuk Tribal Council for two decades. He is also a past director of the Tuolumne Economic Development Authority. As Chairman of the Tribe, Kevin has Executive and oversight responsibility for the tribal government and oversight over all of the business holdings of the Tribe. He also serves as spokesperson for the Tribe at community, County, State and Federal functions and meetings.

Prior to being elected as Tribal Chairman, Kevin was employed by Mountain Home Conservation Center #10 and Sierra Conservation Center as a Correctional Officer and by Sonora and Summerville schools as the a wrestling coach.

Kevin dedicates a significant amount of time to serving his community, serving as director to the Mother Lode Fair Board, the past director with the Tuolumne County Chamber of Commerce, the past director of the Tuolumne Me-Wuk Indian Health Board and a past board member of the M.A.C.T. Indian Health, and the California Rural Indian Health Board. Kevin is also a present State of California appointee to the Citizen's Advisory Board for the Sierra Conservation Center.

Kevin holds an Honorary Degree, of "Master of Arts in Cultural Resource Monitoring," from the Sonoma State University, and is a "Certified Tribal Court Gaming Commissioner," from the National Judicial College.
