Craig Mayer is a 1974 graduate of Duquesne University Law School and a 1968 graduate of Penn State University. From 2004 to 2014 Mr. Mayer was General Counsel for Pennsylvania General Energy Company, LLC (PGE) and is currently PGE's Vice President for Government Relations and an advising legal counsel. PGE is headquartered in Warren, Pennsylvania and has conducted oil and gas exploration and production activity in Pennsylvania for over 30 years. PGE was active in supporting the Pennsylvania Oil and Gas Association (PIOGA) in the *Minard Run* litigation involving the Allegheny National Forest and in this regard Mr. Mayer continues to serve as the Chairman of the PIOGA Standing Committee on the Allegheny National Forest. He has held this position since the spring of 2008 when the Committee was established.

Mr. Mayer is also Vice-Chairman of the Marcellus Shale Coalition (MSC) Legal Committee and is a member of the Executive components of the Board of Directors of both the MSC and PIOGA trade associations. Mr. Mayer is also owner and operator of a 30 acre riverside family campground established in 1998 and located in Bedford County. A retired United States Marine Corps Officer, Mr. Mayer served from 1968 to 1992 in various postings to include combat duty in Vietnam, Head of the Marine Corp's Judge Advocate Division Operations and International Law Branch, and as the accredited United States Defense and Naval Attache at the US Embassy Suva, Fiji. From 2000 through 2002, in a civilian capacity, Mr. Mayer worked in the Sinai Peninsula in Egypt and Israel as a Team Leader and International Observer with the US sponsored Multinational Force and Observers mission monitoring compliance with the military limitations of the Camp David Peace Treaty Accords.

Mr. Mayer is the father of two sons. Mr. Mayer's wife of 42 years, Carole, passed away in February 2012.
