Current efforts include report language for the San Luis Transmission Project and appropriations for salmonid genetic sampling to improve Projects' operations and species management, in cooperation with the California Salmon Council.
- Administer and direct internal, cooperative, and collaborative science efforts in support of administrative, legislative, and litigation efforts. Direct and coordinate work among staff, consultants, partners, State and federal representatives, and interested parties. Communicate findings to partners, State and federal representatives, and interested parties directly and through independent science panel reviews and symposiums. Manage associated contracts, budgets, and board reports.
- Administer and assist in the development and revisions of the Westside Integrated Water Resources Plan. Communicate and coordinate with stakeholders and State representatives, direct consultants, and manage activity agreements, memorandums of agreement, board reports, budgets, contracts, and grants.
- Administer and assist in the development of State grant applications to fund integrated water resource planning, project implementation, flood management, and disadvantaged communities' projects. Communicate and coordinate with stakeholders and State representatives, direct

consultants, and manage activity agreements, memorandums of agreement, board reports budgets, and contracts.

- Assist in efforts to develop long-term solutions to chronic CVP water supply shortages, including the Bay Delta Conservation Plan, federal storage feasibility studies, South Delta Improvements Program, Two Gates Fish Protection Demonstration Project. Direct and coordinate work among staff, consultants, partners, State and federal representatives, environmental organizations, and other interested parties. Communicate issues to State and federal representatives, media, and other interested parties. Manage contracts, budgets, and board reports. In the BDCP, participate in virtually every aspect of plan development: conservation strategies, operations, science, governance, and finance.
- Represent Authority interests in affiliated associations including the Central Valley Project Water Association, the Association of California Water Agencies, the Family Farm Alliance, and the California Farm Water Coalition. Participate on committees and workgroups, research, negotiate, and draft agreements, letters, documents, and memoranda, develop and communicate information. Current Chair of the Association of California Water Agencies Federal Affairs Committee Water Supply Subcommittee.
- Represent Authority interests in State and federal water policy initiatives. Research, develop, and deliver information and testimony before commissions, councils, and State and federal administrative and legislative bodies. Major efforts include participating in the CVPIA Program Activity Review, which informed the Bush Administration's "Expect More" government performance review initiative; CALFED Program Governance review culminating with testimony before the Little Hoover Commission; National Academies' National Research Council's published review of the federal biological opinions "A Scientific Assessment of Alternatives for Reducing Water Management Effects on Threatened and Endangered Fishes in California's Bay-Delta", testimony before the House Water & Power Subcommittee in opposition to guaranteed, permanent funding for Trinity Restoration Program, and drought legislation development.
