Dear Chairman Hastings and Ranking Member DeFazio:

On behalf of the Skamania County Chamber of Commerce, a non-profit organization dedicated to increasing the economic prosperity of our rural communities in Washington state, I encourage you to support H.R. 1526 currently awaiting approval by the House of Representatives. The bill's short title is Healthy Forests for Healthy Communities. The intent of the Legislation is to allow the United States Forest Service to have the tools necessary to achieve and maintain a sustainable timber harvest. One result will be the capacity to create family wage jobs in rural forested communities

Since 2000, counties and schools in 41 states have been receiving payments in lieu of harvest receipts through the Secure Rural Schools and Community Self Determination Act. While the payments have been very helpful to maintain county roads and help with basic education programs they are not a substitute for family wage jobs and the tax base those jobs create. A healthy forest products industry also returns to our communities a sense of pride that they can be self-supporting and do not need a check from the federal government.

For most of the rural forested communities there is not a replacement for the family wage jobs provided by the forest products industry and the services that support that industry. Simply stated too much of our land base is owned by the Federal Government and managed by the Forest Service.

Currently many of our communities in Washington and across the country have serious double digit unemployment, an unacceptable number of students on free and reduced lunches and attendant social issues that simply do not allow for a healthy community. No one is suggesting we over harvest and damage the environment. To the contrary, this legislation allows for harvest that increases the forest's ability to exist in a healthier state and provide desperately needed family wage jobs.

We ask that you support H.R. 1526 when it comes to the floor for a vote.
