*I am a lawyer licensed to practice law in California, Washington State, and the District of Columbia. My undergraduate degree is from Stanford University and my law degrees are from the University of Washington School of Law (J.D./LL.M in Law and Marine Affairs). I have been a licensed lawyer since 1970.*

*I have served as Staff Counsel and General Counsel of the U.S. Senate Committee on Commerce and as Deputy Administrator and Acting Administrator of NOAA. During my time working for Senate Magnuson, I handled about 10-15 new laws each year for four years. At NOAA, I was responsible for ocean policy coordination, in addition to Congressional Affairs oversight. I have had experience in treaty negotiations involving fishery management, trade, and the Law of the Sea. My area of practice has been representation of commercial fishery entities here in the United States and in other countries, including Mexico, Canada, Japan, Taiwan, Korea, China, the Solomon Islands, the Marshall Islands, and the Federated States of Micronesia. Recently, much of my work has been in defending fishery enforcement cases both here and in other countries, as well as counseling on compliance with U.S. laws and conservation and management measures issued by Regional Fishery Management Organizations.*

1. *Pacific Dawn LLC v. Penny Pritzker, No. 14-14224, pending in the U.S. Court of Appeals, Ninth Circuit. This case challenges the method by which IFQ was initially allocated to participants in the West Coast Groundfishery, in particular the Pacific whiting fishery. Our clients are claiming that IFQ should be allocated on the basis of all history in the fishery through at least 2010, whereas the actual allocations were based on history only up to 2003 and 2004 (for processors). In addition, our clients object to the fact that IFQ was allocated to permit holders who had dropped out of the Pacific whiting fishery as of those dates and were not "presently participating" in the fishery at the time the allocations were initially made in 2011. The applicable statute is the Magnuson-Stevens Act.*

2. State of Alaska v. Lubchenco, 825 F.Supp.2d 209 (D.D.C. 2011). Our firm represented an intervenor, Escopeta Coil Company, in a suit brought by the State of Alaska with regard to the listing of the Cook Inlet beluga whale population as endangered under the Endangered Species Act.

3. Civil Penalty cases: While these cases are not technically "lawsuits or petitions", our firm is currently defending various companies in 12 civil penalty proceedings at various stages pending before NOAA, either Administrative Law Judges or the Administrator on appeal. These cases involve alleged civil penalty violations under the Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Convention Implementation Act, the Magnuson-Stevens Act, or the Marine Mammal Protection Act. The lead Respondents in each case are: Matthew James Freitas (Consol. Cases No. PI-0904338, PI-000365, PI-000367, PI-000369, and PI-000371); Anthony Black (PI-0904340); Benjamin Brown Maughan III (PI-1101249); Pacific Ranger LLC (PI-1101523); Craig Bolton(AK-1200300); Lawrence Wagner (PI-1103559); Raymond L. Fournier (PI-1100409); and Tony Da Silva (PI-1100830). Our firm previously represented Peter Pan Seafoods, Inc. in a civil penalty matter under the Magnuson-Stevens Act that was settled in 2012 (AK-0401011).
