Thank you for your interest in applying for an internship with the Committee on Natural Resources on Chairman Westerman's staff.

The U.S. House of Representatives has [20 Standing Committees](#). These Standing Committees are the permanent Committees of the House that conduct legislative work over a policy issue area, prior to moving bills to the House floor for a vote by the full House of Representatives.

Congressman Westerman serves as the Chairman (i.e. the lead Republican) of the House Natural Resources Committee. Typically, a House Committee with authorizing authority has jurisdiction over a Federal agency. The Natural Resources Committee has authorizing authority over the U.S. Department of the Interior (DOI). In addition to DOI, the Natural Resources Committee has authorizing authority over the Department of Commerce's National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Fisheries Service, the Department of Agriculture's U.S. Forest Service, and a shared authority with the Department of Energy over the U.S. Power Marketing Administrations.

The House Natural Resources Committee considers a wide range of legislation on issues including: American energy production and leasing, fisheries and wildlife management, federal lands access, and tribal issues and the U.S. territories.
