The Sites Project Authority (Authority) has not received any federal grants since it was formed in 2010.

In 2015, a cost-share agreement was executed with the Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) to advance the North of Delta Offstream Storage (NODOS) project as authorized under CalFed (PL 108-361; 118 Stat. 1688, Section 103(d)(1)(A)(ii)(I)). NODOS is the federal name for the Sites Project. Reclamation has used CalFed funds to provide in-kind services related to leading the preparation of the feasibility report, whereas the Authority has used its funds to lead the preparation of the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and preparation of the Environmental Impact Report (EIR) in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

Federal spending to advance CalFed storage projects is also subject to having local participation where Reclamation's cost-share can't exceed 50%. In the cost-share agreement, Reclamation has agreed to spend up to \$2,000,000 and the Authority up to \$5,000,000. However, through December

2017, the Authority has spent over \$10,500,000 and plans to spend an additional \$8,000,000 through 2018.
