Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Sea Turtle Rescue As-3 sistance and Rehabilitation Act of 2023".

4 SEC. 2. SEA TURTLE RESCUE ASSISTANCE AND REHABILI-5 TATION GRANT PROGRAM.

6 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary shall establish 7 a grant program, to be known as the "Sea Turtle Rescue 8 Assistance and Rehabilitation Grant Program", to encour-9 age and facilitate coordinated rapid response and rescue 10 by awarding grants for the purposes described in sub-11 section (c).

(b) DESIGNATION OF STRANDING AND REHABILITATION REGIONS.—The Secretary shall designate geographic
regions of the United States as stranding and rehabilitation regions for the purposes of carrying out this section.
(c) PURPOSES.—The purposes of the Program are to
provide for—

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(1) the recovery, short- or long-term care,
 transportation, and treatment of stranded marine
 turtles;

4 (2) the release of rescued and recovered marine
5 turtles;

6 (3) the collection of data and samples from
7 stranded marine turtles for scientific research re8 lated to marine turtle health; and

9 (4) facility operation costs that are directly re10 lated to activities described in paragraphs (1), (2),
11 and (3).

12 (d) EQUITABLE DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS.—The 13 Secretary shall ensure, to the extent practicable, that 14 funds awarded under this section are distributed equitably 15 among stranding and rehabilitation regions, taking into 16 account—

(1) the number of stranding and rehabilitation
events that occurred in each stranding and rehabilitation region in the preceding 5 years; and

20 (2) the conservation priorities and recovery
21 needs of species of marine turtles that are threat22 ened or endangered under the Endangered Species
23 Act of 1973 (16 U.S.C. 1531 et seq.).

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1 (e) APPLICATION.—An applicant for a grant under 2 this section shall submit an application in such form and 3 manner as the Secretary shall prescribe.

4 (f) GRANT CRITERIA.—

5 (1) DEVELOPMENT OF CRITERIA.—The Sec-6 retary shall, in consultation with the Director of the 7 United States Fish and Wildlife Service, establish by 8 regulation appropriate criteria for awarding grants 9 under this section.

10 (2) STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT.—As part of 11 the process for developing and finalizing criteria 12 under paragraph (1), the Secretary shall, in con-13 sultation with the Director of the United States Fish 14 and Wildlife Service, provide opportunities for en-15 gagement with representatives from stranding and 16 rehabilitation regions and representatives of State 17 governments and public and private organizations 18 with an established record in coordination, rescue, 19 rehabilitation, and release, as well as related sci-20 entific research, marine conservation, and forensic 21 science, with respect to stranded marine turtles.

22 (3) REQUIRED CRITERIA.—The criteria devel-23 oped under paragraph (1) shall prioritize applicants with an established record of coordination, rescuing, 24 25 scientific rehabilitation. research. and forensic 1

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science with respect to stranded and rehabilitated

2 marine turtles or conducting scientific research and 3 forensic science on stranded and rehabilitated marine turtles. 4 5 (g) LIMITATIONS.— 6 (1) MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF GRANT.—No grant 7 awarded under this section may exceed \$150,000 in 8 any 12-month period. 9 (2) MATCHING REQUIREMENT.—The non-Fed-10 eral share of the costs of an activity conducted with 11 a grant awarded under the Program shall be not less 12 than 50 percent of such costs, including in-kind 13 services and the use of property. 14 (h) DEFINITIONS.—In this section: 15 (1) MARINE TURTLE.—The term "marine turtle" means any member of the family Cheloniidae or 16 17 Dermochelvidae. 18 (2) PROGRAM.—The term "Program" means 19 the Sea Turtle Rescue Assistance and Rehabilitation 20 Grant Program established under subsection (a). 21 (3) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means 22 the Secretary of Commerce. (4) STRANDING.—The term "stranding" means 23 24 an event in which— 25 (A) a marine turtle is dead and is5
