



Hershel 'Woody' Williams National MEDAL OF HONOR

Monument Location Act



S. 858 (Justice, R-WV)/H.R. 186 (Moore, R-UT) is bipartisan and bicameral legislation that authorizes the National Medal of Honor Monument to be located in a place of prominence on the National Mall in Washington, D.C., a lasting and fitting tribute to the medal's courageous recipients as the nation celebrates the Semiquincentennial in 2026.



- **Honors Our Nation's Veterans:** 163 years after President Abraham Lincoln awarded the nation's first Medal of Honor, this bill is the final step in creating a permanent monument to members of the U.S. Armed Forces that display the highest levels of bravery and valor.
- **No score:** The Memorial will rely exclusively on private donations and require zero taxpayer funding or support.
- **Bipartisan Support:** Passed the House unanimously in the 119th and 118th Congresses and passed the Senate by unanimous consent in March 2026.
