- Extensive experience in NPS Planning, Design, Engineering, Construction, and Contracting of park facilities, Directed, or provided
 indirect oversight of nearly \$1 Billion in rehabilitation, new construction, replacement, or historic preservation.
- Provided direction and support to assure that Grand Teton's and Yellowstone's wildland fire program were compliant with national policy and direction with respect to objectives for firefighter and public safety and for resource benefits.
