

Currently, Nan Stockholm Walden serves as Vice President and Counsel at Farmers Investment Co., the largest pecan growing and processing farm in the world, located in Sahuarita, Arizona.

Nan received a B.A. in environmental studies with honors and distinction from Stanford University, and a J.D. from Stanford Law School where she was President of the Stanford Environmental Law Society.

During her career Nan served as Counsel to the U.S. Senate Environment and Public Works Committee and Counsel for Senator Daniel Patrick Moynihan on the Water Resources Subcommittee. She was Chief of Staff for Senator Bill Bradley who served on the Senate Finance, and Energy and Natural Resources Committees. She was Director of the Presidio Council, a national group of distinguished citizens who advised the Department of Interior on the conversion of the Presidio Army Base in San Francisco to a national park. And she was consultant to a number of foundations including Irvine, Hewlett, Packard and Ford on land regulation and growth issues in rapidly growing states.

In addition to her work at FICO, Nan serves or has served on the boards of The National Immigration Forum, The Arizona Nature Conservancy, the Canoa Ranch Advisory Committee, the Carondelet Foundation, the Santa Cruz Valley Heritage Alliance, the Sonoran Institute, the Santa Lucia Conservancy, the Stanford Law School Environmental and Natural Resources Advisory Council, and the University of Arizona Eller College of Business Associates Board.
