

COMMITTEE MARKUP ACTION SUMMARY REPORT

The Committee on Natural Resources met in open session on March 13, 2014, to consider the following bills:

H.R. 1192 (McClintock), To redesignate Mammoth Peak in Yosemite National Park as "Mount Jessie Benton Frémont".

The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Environmental Regulation was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 1192 by unanimous consent.

Adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.

H.R. 1501 (Jeffries), To direct the Secretary of the Interior to study the suitability and feasibility of designating the Prison Ship Martyrs' Monument in Fort Greene Park, in the New York City borough of Brooklyn, as a unit of the National Park System (*Prison Ship Martyrs' Monument Preservation Act*).

The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Environmental Regulation was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 1501 by unanimous consent.

- An amendment offered by Mr. Bishop of Utah Amendment #1, was AGREED TO by unanimous consent.

Adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives, as amended, by unanimous consent.

H.R. 3222 (Meng), To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a special resource study of sites associated with the 1657 signing of the Flushing Remonstrance in Queens, New York, and for other purposes (*Flushing Remonstrance Study Act*).

The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Environmental Regulation was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 3222 by unanimous consent.

- An amendment offered by Mr. Bishop of Utah Amendment #1, was AGREED TO by unanimous consent.

Adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives, as amended, by unanimous consent.

H.R. 3366 (Walden), To provide for the release of the property interests retained by the United States in certain land conveyed in 1954 by the United States, acting through the Director of the Bureau of Land Management, to the State of Oregon for the establishment of the Hermiston Agricultural Research and Extension Center of Oregon State University in Hermiston, Oregon.

The Subcommittee on Public Lands and Environmental Regulation was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 3366 by unanimous consent.

- An amendment offered by Mr. Bishop of Utah Amendment #1, was AGREED TO by unanimous consent.

Adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives, as amended, by unanimous consent.

H.R. 4032 (Hall), To exempt from Lacey Act Amendments of 1981 certain water transfers by the North Texas Municipal Water District and the Greater Texoma Utility Authority, and for other purposes (*North Texas Invasive Species Barrier Act of 2014*).

The Subcommittee on Fisheries, Wildlife, Oceans and Insular Affairs was discharged from further consideration of H.R. 4032 by unanimous consent.

Adopted and favorably reported to the House of Representatives by unanimous consent.
